BBQ, Bar & Canteen

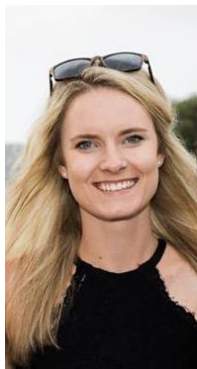
There is plenty of food and refreshments throughout the show to satisfy all those hunger needs. The Lions Club will be cooking up a great BBQ over near the Bar area.

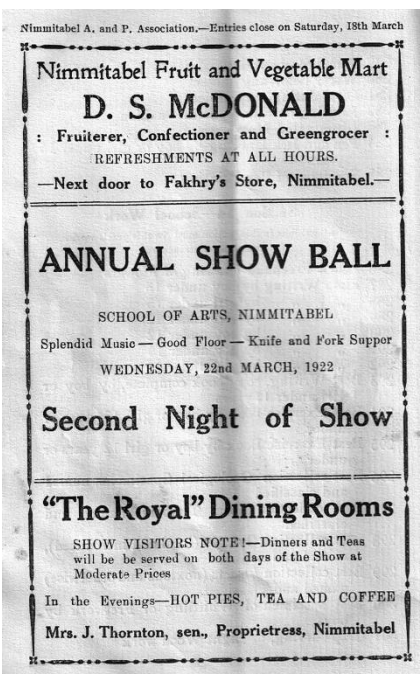
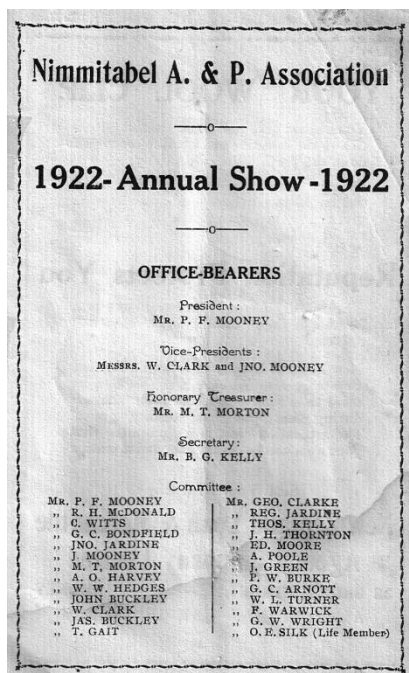
Nimmitabel Showgirl – Shannon Payten McDonald

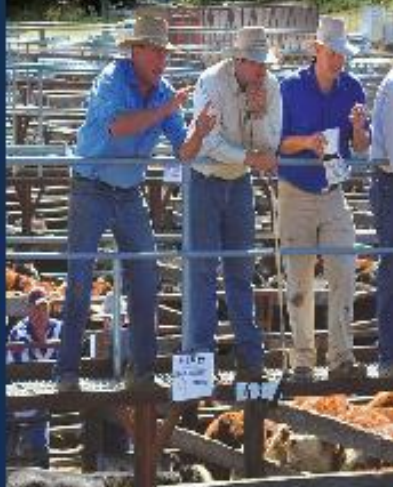

Ingredients:

60g butter (unsalted)
1 ½ cups (firmly packed) brown sugar
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
2 eggs lightly beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup plain flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 cup sour cream
4 cups Rhubarb (sliced 1cm pieces) uncooked
1/3 cup brown sugar extra
1 teaspoon cinnamon extra



Method

Grease and line a 20cm round tin.

Cream butter, sugar and lemon rind until fluffy (about 3-4 minutes). Beat in eggs and vanilla, fold in flours spices alternately with sour cream and rhubarb.

Pour mixture into tin. Combine extra brown sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over mixture. Bake in 180°C oven for about 40 minutes (conventional oven) or bake in 160°C oven for 50 minutes (fan forced oven) or until cooked.
