AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

New ACLUD Administrator Hired

At their May meeting, the Amana Colonies Land Use District Board hired Scott Geiger, who grew up in Amana and is an active volunteer with the Amana Heritage Society and the Amana Historic Sites Foundation, to serve as the ACLUD administrator and clerk.

Richard Budde, who has served in this position for the past three years, is retiring but will continue working closely with Geiger and the board during the transition period. We talked with Budde recently.

Budde wanted to remind all landowners, merchants and residents of the seven villages that this time of year with construction and remodeling jobs, yard enhancements and festivals on everyone's list, keep in mind that all business and residential property in the Amana Colonies Land Use District is subject to ACLUD zoning and regulation.

He also wanted landowners to check out the ACLUD Historic Preservation Grant Program. There are incentive grants available to landowners who may want to repair or restore their historic property. These grants will pay up to 75 percent (60 percent for a business) of the estimated project cost or \$2,500 whichever is less. Yes, projects like tuckpointing, repairing wood siding, restoring exterior porches and doors, replacing windows and erecting street lights or trellises qualify for grant consideration if guidelines are followed.

So why do we have the ACLUD here in the colonies? ACLUD was established by Iowa law in 1985 to protect the historic character of the community while it protects each property owner's investment in their own property. Property values and resale values are determined by several things, but the appearance of the property and the appearance of all neighboring homes and businesses are factors. What your neighbor does or does not do with his property matters, as realtors will tell you.

In 1965 the National Historic Landmark status was granted to the Amana Colonies by the Department of the Interior. This status has been key to promoting the villages as a visitor destination while it celebrates our community identity and heritage.

Furthermore, it has helped the Amana Colonies and its civic/ cultural groups raise money for community improvements. Federal and state grants, private foundation and other types of grants and gifts have been predicated on Amana's NHL standing and have led to the creation of the Amana Heritage Society, the Amana Historic Sites Foundation and the Amana Arts Guild. Community benefits have included the Festhalle barn reclamation, the construction of the Amana Kolonieweg, the creation of the Main Street street widening and sidewalk project, the restoration of the Millrace Canal, the creation of the new Amana Elementary School playground, the construction of the Amana Performing Arts Center, the Amana Woolen Mill/ Hotel Millwright restoration/ reclamation, the Amana Church Sacred Spaces National Trust grant and more. All of these projects gained significance from the NHL status.

Chapter 303, Code of Iowa, establishes the authority and governance power of the ACLUD Board of Trustees to formulate and administer a Land Use Plan including zoning ordinances and resolutions, rules and regulations necessary for the purpose of maintaining and enhancing the distinctive historical and cultural character of the District.

here in the colonies and its board of trustees are elected. The ACLUD board meets the second Monday of each month. The agendas are posted online and published in the Amana Society Bulletin.

This time of year when so many of us are doing remodeling or repair jobs, Budde reminded us that talking to the ACLUD administrator or looking on the alud.org website before you start a project is the best idea.

ACLUD permits are needed for any construction and/ or demolition. You fill out a permit application and specify the work you are doing or having done. This includes constructing, removing or replacing decks, fences, porches, e parking and parking areas, sidewalks, exterior light fixtures, all new construction, exterior remodeling and window replacement, roof replacement, rain gutters, door replacement and door colors, garden houses, garages, trellises and house colors. Permits have time limits. Work cannot begin until a permit is issued. Project changes may require new permits so ask if you make changes to your project.

Work on the interior of a home or business is not subject to permitting.

Permits are needed for erecting or replacing a business / commercial sign, he added. There are permitting rules for temporary, event signs too.

If your property is in the Historic Preservation District (ask or check the map on the website) your permit application will be reviewed by the Historic Preservation Commission. If your property is not in the HPD (historic district) the administrator may be able to issue you the permit.

For permit applications, Amana Colonies Land Use District website at aclud.org or call the office at 319-622-3840 or visit the office to speak with the administrator. He will assist you in determining which application you need to complete and submit.

Two of the most frequently asked questions is this: Is my property in the ACLUD district? Is my property in the historic district? To find that out you may call the ACLUD office or go to the aclud.org website and see a map of your village under the tab "Zoning Maps." Though you may hear otherwise, West Amana does contain property in ACLUD, so check the map or call the ACLUD office to see if your West Amana property is in the district.

HOW TO CREATE A CONTAINER GARDEN

Is your garden limited on space? Consider growing your vegetables in containers! Container gardening occurs when plants are grown in containers such as pots rather than in the ground. This method reduces potential problems with infertile garden sites and "free-living" bacteria such as nematodes.

Containers. Almost any type of container can be used as long as it has drainage holes in the bottom. Common containers include plastic, clay, ceramic, or wood. Check out this resource, store. extension.iastate.edu/product/4179, for more information on size of containers recommended for various vegetables and the amount of potting

Growing mixes. Select quality mixes that are free of plant disease organisms and weed seeds, are less likely to compact, drain well, are lightweight, and hold moisture and nutrients. Soiless potting mixes can be purchased from garden centers and retail outlets and can be prepared with fertilizer included.

Summer care of container gardens.

- · Location. Vegetables grow best in full sunlight. Plants that bear fruit require at least 6 hours of direct sunlight per day. Leafy vegetables tolerate more shade.
- Watering. Plants grown in containers require more frequent watering because they dry out from the sun and wind. Never allow the soil to completely dry out between waterings. Overwatering will also kill plants. Avoid wetting leaves when watering to prevent the development of plant diseases.
- Fertilization. A soluble fertilizer (15-30-15 or 20-20-20) applied once every week is recommended. If using a commercial potting mix, it may not be necessary to begin fertilization until midsummer.
