

Jeff McManus and crew had a couple of fires going already and the gongs were hung up and paper targets were ready to go. Jeff had the town of Meeteetse clear a path for a shooting line and up to the targets. The weather was actually really nice for little while. It might have warmed up to 30 degrees or so, quite balmy for Wyoming. A few of us started shedding coats and gloves. About ½ of the shooters started out on gongs and the other ½ started out on paper. Robert 'Bob' Hampton

Robert H. "Bob" Hampton died at his home in Riverton on Tuesday, April 12, 2010, at the age of 76.

Funeral services are at 10 a.m. on Friday, April 15, at St. Margaret's Catholic Church in Riverton with the Rev. Father Tony Blount S.O.L.T. officiating. Interment follows at Mountain View Cemetery in Riverton.

Robert H. Hampton was born in Wichita Falls, Texas, on Feb. 1, 1935, the son of Ray and Evaladell (Whittaker) Hampton. He attended schools in Texas and Casper.

(Hampton) Fried and husband Gary of Loveland, Colo.; five grandchildren, Tamera Kendrick and husband John of Rock Springs, Robert O. I finally got my son out of bed to participate in the archery and the running grizzly shoot. Of course he beat me in both events. ☺

The running grizzly target is a quick shoot contest as the target comes at you at about 30 mph and you have to cap or prime and shoot the target before the bear eats you. I shot the bear, not the target so I was eaten by the bear. All I can say is wow what a fun shoot. Uncle Albert and crew put together the running bear target and it is a very different, difficult and fun target. The line to shoot the grizzly target was long.

Sean Dunn had 10 archery targets set up from about 15 yards to 40 yards. . Then on Sunday Sean also had another archery target where the archers would compete head to head and the first one to drain the water would be the winner. I guess a few of us needed to practice up on our archery skills before shooting. It was a lot of fun; we just needed a little more time to complete the competition.

Saturday afternoon they had the quail walk again, plus the hawk and knife throwing contest, Ed Kern's spelling bee and council fire. One of the best parts was the [all you could eat] pig roost with all the fixings. Well, at least I was able to walk off the weight gain from the pig roost. It was one great meal. Something about a potluck dinner out in the open air around a fire just makes everything taste great.

Sunday they had the re-entry contest, pistol contest, smoothbore competition, trail walk, archery contest, adult fire starting and the great marshmallow shoot. I did learn that you have to watch out for Jane Black in the marshmallow contest, she is sneaky. What great fun we had. If you were not worn out, you did not participate. The Sheridan Bull shooters passed out all of the awards. I have posted a few pictures from the event. I will hopefully get the shoot results and scores posted on the next newsletter. 'Before you tell that joke, Cowboy, I think it is only fair, Given that you are blind, that you should know five things:


- 1. The bartender is a blonde girl with a baseball bat.*






