She is survived by her husband Leslie Hamilton of Dubois; daughter Tara Golliher of Dubois; her father, Dr. Joseph Corson of Pa.; brother Bill Corson and sister Dr. Ann Corson, both of Pa.; stepson Shad Hamilton and his wife Amanda and their children of Lander; stepdaughter Hope Hamilton of Va.; close friend and band member Norman Winter of Dubois. Uncle Albert and crew put together the running bear target and it is a very different, difficult and fun target. The line to shoot the grizzly target was long.

Sean Dunn had 10 archery targets set up from about 15 yards to 40 yards. Then on Sunday Sean also had another archery target where the archers would compete head to head and the first one to drain the water would be the winner. I guess a few of us needed to practice up on our archery skills before shooting. It was a lot of fun; we just needed a little more time to complete the competition.

Saturday afternoon they had the quail walk again, plus the hawk and knife throwing contest, Ed Kern's spelling bee and council fire. One of the best parts was the [all you could eat] pig roost with all the fixings. Well, at least I was able to walk off the weight gain from the pig roost. It was one great meal. Sunday they had the re-entry contest, pistol contest, smoothbore competition, trail walk, archery contest, adult fire starting and the great marshmallow shoot. 




