Longtime Post Members Honored at Wakes

Julius Riso passed away at 98 years old on Thursday, Sept. 28, 2017. Ceremony at Casey-McCallum



Julius was a World War II veteran who served his country in the 100th Infantry Division, U.S. Army. Among his various combat medals are: American Campaign; Good Conduct; European African Middle East Campaign; Victory Medal. He was also a longtime member of the Kells Grennie American Legion. He retired from Governors Island as a master plumber and moved to Staten Island. He loved fishing and history. He raised his 2 daughters when his wife Sally died too soon.

Paul J. Zalesak was a World War II Veteran who passed away on November 20, 2017 at 89. Ceremony at Hanley's.



Paul was an Honorary member of the Kells – Grennie Post 316 since 1986 (31 Years). He served as the Corporation treasurer for many years and was also an active member of the Post 316 Honor Guard. He will always be Remembered for his Service to the Nation and to the Kells – Grennie American Legion Post.

First Responder Night

At our meeting on September 18th the Post held a First Responder Night Edmund Kells - Richard A. Grennie American Legion Post 316 First annual DETECTIVE SALVADOR DAVILLA COMMUNITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD to recognize two members of the NYPD, FDNY and EMS, who have been nominated by their units for bravery above and beyond.



Salvador Davila who the award was named for - served in the U.S. Air force and from 1960 – 1965. Salvador joined the NYPD in1967attained the rank of detective and retired while serving with the120th Precinct in1987 He r was a special investigator with the attorney general's office 1987 – 2005.

Salvador loved the New Dorp Community where he resided. He also loved soccer and helped found the Staten Island Soccer League and coached the sport at St Charles and St Josephs By the Sea.

Salvador joined the Post in 2004, became a Vice Commander in 2006 and ran the Post 316 Honor Guard and Rifle Squad. He served three years as Post Commander 2007 – 2010.

After the September 11, 2001 attack Salvador was working as a special investigator at ground zero collecting evidence. A few years later he became very ill from the debris in the air but remained a loyal active member of this Post until his passing on December 22, 2012.

Post Commander Carmine Awards Emergency Medical Technicians *Lt. Sheldon Glaubagh* and *Lt. Salvatore Cangilosi.*

Salvatore Cangelosi was born and raised in the New Springville and wanted to join the FDNY all through high school.





He was certified as an Emergency Medical Technician in 2013 after taking a course about pre-hospital emergency care. On April 18, 2016 he entered Probationary EMT School, hitting the streets of Staten Island in July of the same year.

He was assigned to EMS Station 22 where he aided those needing emergency attention both on and off duty. He shows compassion in providing patient care, treating his patients with dignity and respect, like family. EMT Cangelosi is passionate about his job adapting and overcoming any challenges to achieve his objective.

On May 27, 2017 Emergency Medical Technician Salvatore Cangelosi, off duty and in civilian clothes heard a commotion and someone calling for help in front of a restaurant. He responded and found an unconscious man. EMT Cangelosi immediately sent someone to call 911 and got technician kit from his vehicle. He then evaluated the victim's condition and recognized that he was in respiratory arrest. EMT Cangelosi, using a "pocket face mask" delivered rescue breaths and monitored the patient until the arrival of additional responders.

He remained on scene to assist and provided a detailed description of the incident. For this in particular Kells - Grennie American Legion Post 316 honors honor his exemplary services to the citizens of Staten Island.

New York City Emergency Service Technician Lieutenant Sheldon Glaubagh began his career 37 years ago June 16 1980. He started as a Paramedic with NYC EMS Station 33 (now Station 58) before being transferred to Station 3) (now Station 43). After serving in Brooklyn or 13 years, Paramedic Sheldon Glaubagh was promoted to Lieutenant. He went back to EMS Station 33 (now Station 58) in Brooklyn as Lieutenant and served with pride and professionalism.

In 2003 Lt. Glaubagh was reassigned to FDNY EMS Station 22 on Brielle Ave Staten Island. Lt. He was role model for others in the unit. Now in his 37'h year of service Lt. Glaubagh shows care and compassion for the citizens of New York and his subordinates at Station 22 as he has for many years. When he retires it will be a great loss to the FDNY EMS and the citizens of Staten Island. It is with great honor that we the members of the Kells - Grennie American Legion Post 316 honor Lt. Glaubagh for his exemplary service to the citizens of Brooklyn and Staten Island for the past 37 years.

Lester Modelowitz awards fire fighters *Michael Luongo and Rob Mitchell.*



Fire Fighter Michael Luongo was born and raised in Huguenot, grandson of retired (now deceased) FDNY Battalion Chief Frank Caltabellotta. Michael graduated from Tottenville High School and attended East Stroudsburg University before being appointed to the FDNY in June of 2015. After graduating from the FDNY academy he was assigned to Engine160 Staten Island.

Fire Fighter Rob Mitchell a member of the FDNY for the last 15 years started his career in Brooklyn's Engine Company 219 then quickly transferred to Ladder Company 105. In 2014 he became a member of Staten Island Rescue Company 5 Engine160 Clove Road where he continues to work.

On April 17, his company responded to a working fire on the 5th Floor at 145 Lincoln Ave. On arrival a victim was spotted in distress and semi-conscious at a window with heavy dark black smoke pushing overhead. He assisted the victim onto the Aerial Ladder 6 floors up, and began their descent when the victim became unconscious. A Ladder was raised to the sill of the window where Fire Fighter Luongo ascended the ladder. He assured the victim that he was coming for him, that he should remain calm Simultaneously Fire Fighter Rob Mitchell R-5 reached the victim from the interior of the building. The victim could not be removed from the interior due to the heavy fire smoke and clutter. Fire Fighter Luongo and Fire Fighter Mitchell removed the victim out of the 6th floor window onto the ladder, when the victim became unconscious. Fire Fighter Luongo and Fire Fighter Mitchell worked together to secure the victim to the stokes basket and carefully lowered him down to safety.

Fire Fighter Mitchell was able to hold on to the victim and keep from falling to the ground while he waited for assistance from Fire Fighter Luongo. Working together the two men were secured the victim in a stokes basket and brought him down safely.

It is with great honor that we the members of the Kells - Grennie American Legion Post 316 honor these two fighters Michael Luongo and Rob Mitchell for their exemplary services to the citizens of Staten Island

Police Officer Derek Brown was born, raised and still resides in the Port Richmond. He is a graduate of Saint John's University where he earned a Bachelor's Degree of Science in Management and Administration. Officer Brown is an 11-year veteran of the New York City Police Department all served at the 122nd precinct. He has worked on patrol, as part of the precinct based Housing Team, precinct School Safety Team for 6 years and is currently the 122nd Precinct's Youth Officer. In 2013, he was awarded a Department Commendation for work during hurricane Sandy where he performed a water rescue and transported numerous civilians who were stuck in the flood zone to safety.

The last 8 years Officer Brown has worked to provide a safe learning environment for the children and teens in the community. He also mentors children in need and at risk by working directly with them and their families through an at home visit program. Furthermore, he coordinates and teaches the Too Good for Drugs program to proactively combat the drug epidemic which educates children in grades 5, 7 and 9 on the dangers and effects of drugs use. He is also an instructor in the NYPD's Summer Youth Police Academy which is a free program the department offers to keep children in need engaged with the police department and off the street during the summer months.

On October 20, 2017 our Lester Modelowitz ran his annual political forum at the Moravian Church Hall.

Various candidates expressed their proposals to help veterans.



Now and Then

Lester Modelowitz was born in Brooklyn, New York. In August 1966, he was drafted into the U.S. Army and sent to Fort Jackson, South Carolina for Basic Training. He remained there for Advanced Individual Training in Supply and Demand. He was then sent to Fort Lee, Virginia for Advanced Individual Training for Quartermaster and Armorer training for Small Weapons.

In February 1967, he was deployed to Vietnam and was assigned to the 1st Aviation Brigade, 162nd Assault Helicopter Company in Phouc Vinh, 3rd Corps. In May 1967, he was reassigned to the 2nd Battalion 94th Artillery in Dong Ha and Camp JJ Carroll in I Corp. He was classified as a Sp4 and was primarily a Small Weapons Specialist. While being attached to this artillery unit he mostly rode in convoys from Dong Ha to the units firing bases in Northern I-Corps. He returned to the United States in February 1968 and was assigned to Fort Campbell, Kentucky as a supply sergeant. After being discharged from the US Army he was awarded the National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

In September 1968 he married and worked in construction with the Carpenter Union until his retirement in 1992. Lester is a member of the Kells–Grennie American Legion Post 316 where he has served as a Post Commander and County Vice Commander. In 2002 he was the Richmond County Legionnaire of the year.

He is a member of the Disabled American Veterans and the Vietnam Veterans of America where he served as 2nd Vice President of Chapter 421. Lester Modelowitz also volunteered at the Arthur Kill Correctional Facility aiding incarcerated veterans from 1992 – 2001, and was named Volunteer of the Year in 1996., he also helped with Con Thien Memorial Post 1945 which was at the correctional facility.

In 2008, Lester Modelowitz asked State Senator Andrew Lanza to sponsor legislation which would designate March 29th as Vietnam Veterans Day in the State of New York. The bill was signed into law by Governor David Paterson on May 27th, 2008. (Chapter 90 of the laws of 2008). In 2010 Senator Lanza had Lester Modelowitz inducted into the New York State Veterans Hall of Fame. In 2009, Lester Modelowitz helped to organize Senator Lanza and Assemblyman Matthew Titone's first annual Vietnam Veterans' Celebration at Mt. Loretto CYO center on Staten Island. He was also an integral part of the second annual celebration of Vietnam Veterans' Day in 2010 and continues to help each year. Lester is still an active member with the Kells – Grennie American Legion Post 316 and serves as the Post adjutant and did a complete history on Post 316.
