Vail Lake Resort Update

As you all can see, we've been busy! There are now three loop trails you can take from the pickle ball court with more in the works. The first loop we completed was The Vail Lake Trail which is not outlined on this map. We introduced this loop on our group ride back in June. Following is a drawing of what is currently being worked on and trail markings need to be installed yet.

For the most part the trails are flat with a few rolling hills on the Three-point trail. The below map is NOT to scale (smile), but we wanted to give you a peek at what we've accomplished. Each number on the map corresponds to the photos below:




Photo 1

Riders heading north from Hwy 79 South on the '79 Loop Trail'. Riders have views of Palomar Mountain and the hills north of the lake are easy on the eyes.





Photo 2

We are now just South of the Red Shank Grove and are heading up toward the 'Depression Trail'. It's hard to see in the photo, but the ground here is covered with native California wild roses in bloom. From here we crossed under beautiful old oaks before going up the short hill to Hwy 79 South.

Flash's ears point the way up from the Red Shank grove heading up towards 3-point trail with the water tower clearly seen to the left of us.

TVRL Corner



Happy August, everyone. Can you believe it?? TVRL has been busy over the summer. Here are some updates.

Current Projects

- TVRL has joined RCHA in addressing the issue of accessibility to the Vail Lake viewpoint above Glen Oak Hills. We jointly met with a Riverside County Ranger and a Naturalist (who works on the Conservation Area issues up there) to come up with designs for entryways for horses that will prevent motorized vehicles. We had them come to a Director's arena where we tested several options with 3 horses of different sizes and temperaments. It was a useful education for all, and all took away "to do" lists to explore better options than the 3 step stepovers that had recently been installed.
- TVRL has requested bids from fence suppliers so that we can get the trail opened on Rancho Water land to connect the Valle de Los Caballos (VDC) to Oak Mountain road for Vail access from the De Portola side.
- Pot Hole H**1 on Pauba Road between Calle Contento and Butterfield Stage the surveying has been completed on the street redesign and the Project Leader for the trails portion has been in contact with us just this week to show us the trails plan. Work is not likely to be done until next year but is progressing.
- A few landowners in VDC approached us for background on an easement that another landowner had blocked. California Edison has now opened it, and those landowners continue to work to make sure it stays open.





A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY.....


Warner Springs......

.....was founded in 1830 when an American-born Mexican citizen called Juan Jose Warner (born John Trumball Warner) left Connecticut and headed to California, passing through this valley.

From 1849-1851, Warner operated part of the ranch to serve travelers on the Gila River Emigrant Trail (part of the Southern Emigrant Trail) He opened the only trading post between New Mexico and Los Angeles on a wagon road developed after the Mexican-American War.



When thousands of emigrants began flowing to California, Warner's Ranch was a stop on the San Antonio-San Diego Mail Line in 1857 and the Butterfield Overland Mail stagecoach line between 1858 and 1860. It was linked to San Diego by the San Diego-Fort Yuma mail route via the road through Santa Isabel to San Diego. Travelers rested here along their journey, after the trip through the desert.




