21. He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him.

CHUCK SWINDOLL - on this subject - has this to say (in his book *Strengthening Your Grip*):

"The aggressive attitude reacts to circumstances with blame. We blame ourselves or someone else, or God, or if we can't find a tangible scapegoat, we blame "fate." What an absolute waste! When we blame ourselves, we multiply our guilt, we rivet ourselves to the past (another "dangling" unchangeable), and we decrease our already low self-esteem. If we choose to blame God, we cut off our single source of power. Doubt replaces trust, and we put down roots of bitterness that can make us cynical. If we blame others, we enlarge the distance between us and them. We alienate. We poison a relationship. We settle for something much less than God intended. And on top of all that, we do not find relief!

Blame never affirms, it assaults.
Blame never restores, it wounds.
Blame never solves, it complicates.
Blame never unites, it separates.
Blame never smiles, it frowns.
Blame never forgives, it rejects.
Blame never forgets, it remembers.
Blame never builds, it destroys.

Let's admit it...not until we stop blaming will we start enjoying health and happiness again! This was underscored as I read the following words recently:

'...one of the most innovative psychologists in this half of the twentieth century...said recently that he considers only one kind of couselee relatively hopeless: that person who blames other people for his or her problems. If you can own the mess you're in, he says, there is hope for you and help available. As long as you blame others, you will be a victim for the rest of your life.'

Blame backfires, hurting us more than the object of our resentment."

The Lord does not keep any angels below; So when he is doing the best that he can remember the Preacher is only a man!


TITHES AND OFFERINGS


Bro. & Sister Irwin Delk's daughter has moved to Spearman, Texas to work in our school system. We are so happy to have her with us.

SATAN'S SUBTILITY

There is a super-imposed vision found in Isaiah 14:4-20 giving the account of satan being cast from his place with other angels around the throne of God. The taunt in this scripture is addressed to the king of Babylon and mentions the golden city. This is calling satan the king of the Babylon which shall exist during the reign of the antichrist. Revelation 18:16 is talking of the destruction of that city when we read, "And saying, Alas, alas that great city, that was clothed in fine linen, and purple, and scarlet, and decked with gold and precious stones, and pearls!" In Isaiah 14:12-14 we read, "How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How art thou cut down to the ground, which didst weaken the nations! For thou hast said in thine heart, I will ascend into the heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God: I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the north; I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most High." Then in Ezekial 28:11-19 is another super-imposed vision addressed to the king of Tyrus where we can see more of the reason for satan losing his position as one of God's angels. Verses 14, 15, 17 read, "Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou hast walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day thou was created, till iniquity was found in thee. Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee." Here we learn satan was an anointed angel at the throne of God and perfect in his ways but his heart was lifted up. He thought to set his throne above the stars of God and to be like the most high. This was iniquity and because of his vanity he was cast out.

There are differences of opinions about when satan was cast from around the throne of God but whenever it was he took with him that vanity and desire to be as high in authority as God. Revelation 20:2 calls him "The dragon, that old serpent, which is the devil and satan." When he met Eve in the garden he was still trying to defeat the plan of God and to cause the most intellectual of God's whole creation to follow satan instead of God. Satan did not openly ask Eve to turn from God but through his subtily he planted the desire for that which was forbidden.

Genesis 3:1-5 reads, "Now the serpent was more subtle than any beast of the field which the Lord God has made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die. And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as God's, knowing good and evil." What a subtle way to tempt her into disobedience. First he accused God of not telling the truth then satan appealed to Eve's vanity by telling her she could be as wise as God. But satan did not show Adam and Eve all the toils and heartaches they would have to endure through the years ahead if they ate that

forbidden fruit. He did not tell them they would have thorns and thistles to grow in their fields and garden instead of the beauties in the garden of Eden. He did not show them their sin of disobedience would plant a seed of rebellion and desire for things of sin in the souls of future generation. He did not tell them of the heartaches and sadness that seed of rebellion would cause them when one of their sons would kill the other because of the jealousy he harbored and his iniquity in wanting to choose his own kind of sacrifice. All down through the ages satan has been the adversary of man and through his subtily he seems to still be able to lead his victims down the road to destruction instead of letting them listen to those who would point them up the gentle incline to the true happiness and joy only God can give with a goal of eternal life.

Satan is still presenting only one side of the picture. Take a look at the commercials on radio, in magazines and on the T.V. The advertisements of cigarettes, and alcoholic drinks are continually directed toward our youth. And though drugs are not openly advertised through the legitimate channels to advertise, they are openly advertised through much of the entertainment. Satan uses pictures of young, vigorous and beautiful youth, both men and women, enjoying the taste, the lift and the popularity gained in joining the crowd who use those habit forming products. What satan does not show to the youth who are subjected to these commercials is the results of the use of these products - many of them made from the weeds caused to grow after the fall of Adam and Eve. Many cancers are caused from the use of tobacco and a large percent of the highway deaths are caused because someone tried to drive after drinking alcoholic beverages. Drugs cause physical problems of various kinds and often lead to overdoses and death, either in suicide or to another person. Satan never tells of the anguish to the one who tries to break the habit of drugs, but unless a person wants to go farther and farther into the oblivion from these drugs, the only way is to quit taking them. There was once a woman chosen to be placed in our custody while she was overcoming her habit. Satan had not told her of the sleepless nights and when she did sleep of the horrible nightmares she would have and the screams she would have from the terrible torments. He did not mention to her of the days she could not keep anything on her stomach. I sat at night and held her hand while she trembled until the bed shook but satan does not picture this to the one who starts on the road of eventually becoming an addict. The demonic driven drug pusher only cares about the sale and if you can't pay you can suffer as far as he is concerned. Satan doesn't tell of all these ills, he only causes a person to rebel against all warnings from any reliable source. Drugs and alcohol are the root of the causes from many of the broken homes today and the suffering of child abuse.

Music has been enjoyed by most people since very early times. It is mentioned in the Bible as early as the time of Jacob, Genesis 31:27. It has been used to express both joys and feelings of sadness. After the children of Israel crossed the Red Sea Miriam led the people in a song of praise for the deliverance of the people from Egypt. David played on a harp to soothe the troubled mind of King Saul. Many others mention of music both in song and instrumental are in the Bible. Down through the ages music has been used to express the individual inner-most feelings. Sacred music expresses a feeling of praise or worship. Then we have the folk songs and instrumental music of the orchestras and the

bands. These all have a place in meaningful entertainment but then satan entered the field of music. There have been some changes in music along with the forms of entertainment. The sound of Jazz was one of the bigger changes, with its African origin type of music. Then in the mid fifties came another new sound and type of entertainment. In 1954 a disc jockey described the new fad in music as Rock and Roll. This name was borrowed from the ghetto community. There the term was used as a descriptive expression referring to fornication. The name stuck. The lyrics of rock and roll explore the fringes of lyrical pornography. The titles and covers on the albums are often pornographic and the rock singers often give the impression they practice what they preach. One rock singer declared that "Rock and Roll is 99 percent sex." The point of danger is not that your teenager has this knowledge but many times they idolize these singers and look upon them as oracles of wisdom about life and love.

Today we see homosexuality viewed rather favorably. These men and women are in the public eye and that is bound to be of a certain degree of influence to the younger generation. Today's major trend setters of style and morality are the entertainment stars. One writer wrote, "Unless you've been living in a cave in outer Mongolia you know only too well that today's child is threatened with homosexual influences you didn't have to contend with" Because of the sodomy of Sodom and Gomorrah, God destroyed both of those cities and their inhabitants with fire and brimstone in the time of Abraham and Lot. Genesis 19:1-25.

Because of the satanic dominance in the lives of the rock stars and the subtle influence of satan, himself, the performance of the rock singers have the greatest influence of all upon the values of today's teenagers. While singing some to their tunes one rock group distributed phony cocaine to the audience with an actual snow shovel. Such practices can have a disastrous effect upon a young person who "digs" the music of such artist. The biggest influence of promoting drugs in the rock scene is the image of the singers, not the song. Being arrested for drug violations is almost fashionable in some rock circles and certainly not unusual. Consequently if your child has been attending such concerts and later should be offered a dose of dope, he may well remember his favorite rock artist enjoyed it. A prominent rock manager stated, "No matter what anyone tells you, drugs will always be a part of the rock scene." When the teenager sees all the glitter and glamor on the stage, satan does not tell him of the hours of being stoned into oblivion, the sickness that follows and the terrible night-marish existence until they get another fix. Satan does not tell the youthful, brilliant, admiring young people of the audience that those same stars they have are many of them tired of their own existence but are so bound by satan they cannot find a way out. Eventually a sizable list has shown many of them have taken an overdose and others fade out of the entertainment world; some of them addicted to drugs too much to appear in the public eye any more. Some who do "kick" the drug habit are marked for the rest of their lives because of the damage drugs has done to their minds. You may be warning your child about drugs but have you told him that whoever purchases their records or a ticket to one of their concerts is helping to support their drug habits? II John 11 says, "For he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds." With the rise of drug usage came a rise in demon invasion. The using of drugs is not a new

thing but like homosexuality, it has come out in the open. Thus it has become popular in certain circles and the more usage of drugs brings a greater rebellion against God and more invasion by demons. Many of the rock stars are deeply involved with one or more of the occult religions. Usually it is those of demonic spirits such as spiritualism or of the pagan religions of the far east. God has been opposed to those pagan religions since the time of Nimrod, Genesis 10:8 and 9. Verse 9 says Nimrod was mighty hunter before the Lord which means he hunted out and persecuted anyone who served the True and Living God. He was a mighty hunter of men. Satan uses people today to destroy others and to keep them from serving God. You may feel your child is only enjoying the musicianship of his favorite artist but through the subtle cunningness of satan, he is planting that desire to pattern himself after the music then to idolize the star. That fatal beat in the music follows him wherever he goes and he continues to hear it.

Then we come to disco. The word disco is a shortened form of a French word meaning "record library." It was used in the sixties to describe rock night clubs where the emphasis was on dancing. Disco is not only what you do but also where you are going. all disco is rock but not all rock is disco. It uses a special facet of its beat that borrows from a diverse heritage fusing Latin rhythms with black styles made popular by early rock stars. All disco has a sound that is designed to make you dance and just keep on dancing. Some of the dances resemble the heathen dances of pagan religions. For gays, disco became the rallying cry to come out of the closet. They did, and today one rock promoter estimates that 75 percent of all discos are gay operated. The manager of one disco group, who is a publicly acknowledged homosexual, declares, "I am sincerely trying to produce songs to make the gay people more acceptable." The Encyclopedia Americana says of dancing: "It may be said that primitive man - yesterday and today - found his reason for dancing in religion or magic, in his own physical energy, in sexual drives and in the need to communicate; and modern man, if he pauses for analysis, will find these ancient sources provide the stimuli for all his dances, folk or theatrical, to this day."

The youth of our land learn by example. We can talk to them and tell them of the dangers and the lack of christian character in rock and roll, the demonic frenzy in the disco dances, the loss of self esteem in the use of drugs and the flaunting of God's law in homosexuality but unless adults clean up their examples before them, what can we expect? Christian parents do not sanction x-rated movies at the theater but how about the out dated movies and the horror movies on the late night shows on the T.V.? The T.V. brings these off key movies right into the living room of our homes. Is this any better than the rock music and the disco for example? The most degrading of T.V. programs is the soap opera. These soap operas show a continual parade of unfaithfulness in marriage, of divorces, abortion and illegitimate children! Yet we find so many christians so entangled with these fictitious characters they weep and laugh with them in their problems. Some even try to copy each emotional trauma as if the actors were real people. What is pure make-believe has become reality for soap addicts. What people see portrayed on the screen may not seem nearly so repulsive in real life once they have become

accustomed to seeing it. It is just another trick of satan to subtily cause God's people to let down their standards and live below what God intended. First we see it on T.V. then we see it practiced in real life and next we condone it in our churches!

We should be concerned about our youth and want them to be good Christians and serve God and country in a way that takes advantage of all the blessings God has for them but how can we condone the soap operas and x-rated movies in our living rooms and condemn the music they listen to in the privacy of their own rooms?

We need to take heed to the words Moses gave to the children of Israel when he said, "Hear O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all they soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently to thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates." Deuteronomy 6:4-9.
