

Introduction

Cumberland Road Fire Department (CRFD) personnel responded to 1769 calls for service from January 1st 2019 through December 31st 2019. This represents a decrease of approximately 17% from 2018. The department did see a 12% increase in fire responses within codes 100-130 (Fires) in the National Fire Incident Reporting System.

As technology continues to evolve; so do response protocols and patterns. The decrease in response volume was correlated with changes to the Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL) dispatch system. A broader window of response area for AVL dispatch led to neighboring departments responding to 279 of the 1208 calls for service within the fire district. Simultaneously, CRFD Personnel responded to fewer incidents in neighboring districts, due to their close proximity to each other and AVL no longer prompting for CRFD units to respond.





Fire Related Responses

- The Cumberland Road Fire Department responsed to a total of 69 structure fires in 2019, including mutual and automatic aid responses.
- Personnel responded to 19 structure fires within the initial response district of the Cumberland Road Fire Department. This represented an approximate 17% decrease in structure fires within the district as compared to 2018.
- Overall fire responses including vehicles and non-dwellings saw an increase of appoximately 12%.
- There was one fire related deaths within the Cumberland Road Fire Department initial response district in 2019. The fire was deemed to have been caused by improper or unsafe use of smoking materials.



Emergency Medical Related Responses

- The Cumberland Road Fire Department responded to a total of 957 EMS or rescue related calls for service in 2019. This represented a decrease of approximately 18% from 2018.
- Within the Cumberland Road Fire Department initial response area, personnel responded to a total of 645 EMS or rescue related calls for service, which corrolates with the decrease in overal EMS resonponses of about 18%.

Training

- Personnel, both part time staff and volunteer members, completed a total of 11,062 hours of training in 2019.
- A noted increase in training hours from 2018's 10,461 hours is a reflection of the departments focus on meeting and exceeding minimum standards set forth by NCOSFM.
