#### **MINUTES FOR May, June, August, September**

#### MAY 2012

The GSSN met at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV on Wednesday, May 2, 2012 at 6:30 PM. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order and led in pledging allegiance to the flag. He welcomed all (87 signed in & there were 14 visitors). Dara gave the Treasurer's Report after which Morris made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as read; Pam Goulder seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous in favor and it was approved. Ian briefly commented on the last outing and said that the next outing would be May 19 & 20<sup>th</sup> at Section 34 claim. JUNE 2012 The GSSN met at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV on Wednesday, June 6, 2012. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM & led in pledging allegiance to the flag. He welcomed all -- there were 6 visitors and 40 people signed in. Dara gave the Treasurer's Report. Fred Zajac made a motion to approve the report as read & Dennis seconded the motion. The vote was unanimously in favor and it was approved. Next Ian asked about the previous month's minutes as published in the HighGrader and Mark made a motion to approve them; Jim seconded the motion and they were approved by unanimous vote.
