Estimated Full-Time Costs





Selecting a degree that prepares you for life after graduation will make your future bright.

Types of Degrees

Students can earn different types of degrees based on their academic and career goals. The academic requirements of the program, average time to complete the degree and job opportunities for graduates are important factors to consider.

- An Associate of Arts prepares students to pursue a four-year baccalaureate degree. Most degrees require 60 credits and can
 be completed in two years. Students who earn an Associate of Arts at a state college are guaranteed admission to a state
 university, although not necessarily the university of their choice.
- An Associate of Science prepares students to directly enter the workforce. Most degrees require 60 credits and can be completed in two years. Students who earn an Associate of Science are not guaranteed admission to a state university.
- A Baccalaureate of Arts or Baccalaureate of Science, known commonly as a bachelor's degree, is a four-year degree. These
 types of degrees are offered at all state universities and most state colleges.

In those cases, the classroom teacher can determine which semester to implement the career and education content. The course can be taught by any member of the staff and students must develop a personalized academic and career plan. The MyCareerShines career planning system is available free of charge to all Florida middle and high schools to assist students in exploring career options and developing an academic and career plan.






Florida's Fastest Growing Occupations

What are the diploma options?

Students must successfully complete one of the following diploma options:

- 24-credit standard diploma
- 18-credit Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning (ACCEL) option
- Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) curriculum
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma curriculum

What are the state assessment requirements?

Students must pass the following statewide assessments:

- Grade 10 ELA (or ACT/SAT concordant score)
- Algebra I end-of-course (EOC) and the results constitute thirty percent of the final course grade* or a comparative score on the Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.)

Students must participate in the EOC assessments, and the results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade*. These assessments are in the following subjects:

- Biology I
- U.S. History
- Geometry
- Algebra II (if enrolled)

*Special Note: Thirty percent not applicable if not enrolled in the course but passed the EOC. What are the requirements for the 24-credit standard diploma option?

4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)

- ELA I, II, III, IV
- ELA honors, AP, AICE, IB and dual enrollment courses may satisfy this requirement.

4 Credits Mathematics

- One of which must be Algebra I and one of which must be Geometry.
- Industry certifications that lead to college credit may substitute for up to two mathematics credits (except for Algebra I and Geometry).

3 Credits Science

- One of which must be Biology I, two of which must be equally rigorous science courses.
- Two of the three required credits must have a laboratory component.
- An industry certification that leads to college credit substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology I).
- An identified rigorous computer science course with a related industry certification substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology I).
