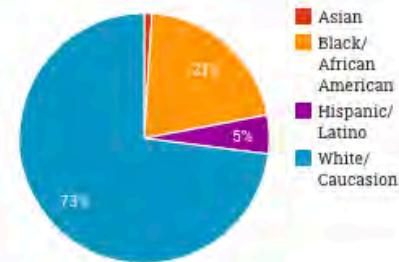

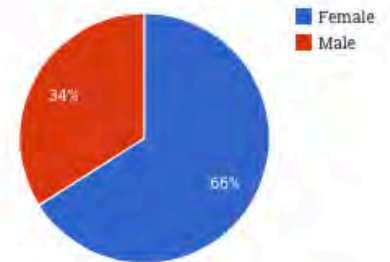

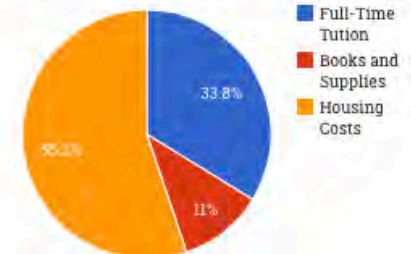

Selecting a degree that prepares you for life after graduation will make your future bright.

### Types of Degrees

Students can earn different types of degrees based on their academic and career goals. The academic requirements of the program, average time to complete the degree and job opportunities for graduates are important factors to consider.

- An Associate of Arts prepares students to pursue a four-year baccalaureate degree. Most degrees require 60 credits and can be completed in two years. Students who earn an Associate of Arts at a state college are guaranteed admission to a state university, although not necessarily the university of their choice.
- An Associate of Science prepares students to directly enter the workforce. Most degrees require 60 credits and can be completed in two years. Students who earn an Associate of Science are not guaranteed admission to a state university.
- A Baccalaureate of Arts or Baccalaureate of Science, known commonly as a bachelor's degree, is a four-year degree. These types of degrees are offered at all state universities and most state colleges.

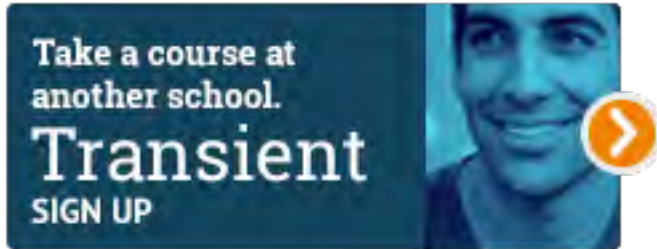

**2 FIND OUT EXACTLY WHAT THE TEST WILL COVER**

Ask your instructor questions like:

- What material will the test cover?
- Which topics are most important?
- Will there be a test review?

**3 FIND A GOOD PLACE TO STUDY**

Assign yourself a specific place to study and set a regular time to study each day.


Make sure that your study place is comfortable and free from distractions.

**4 CREATE YOUR OWN STUDY GUIDES**

After each class and after you read each chapter in your textbook, write down three to five questions (per chapter) that you think your teacher may ask on the exam.

By the time your test rolls around, you will have a great study tool for preparing for your test.

### Helpful Study Tips



**5 GO TO CLASS AND TAKE GOOD NOTES**

There is no substitute for being present in lecture and taking your own set of notes.

Most exams will focus on lecture material.

Therefore, a complete set of useable lecture notes is your most important study tool.

**6 CREATE FLASH CARDS**

Flash cards are easy to make. On one side write a key term or a question, and on the other side write the definition or the answer. Flash cards are a helpful tool that will allow you to quiz yourself as you prepare for your tests.

**7 STUDY WITH OTHER STUDENTS**

Find a study partner the first week of class and make it part of your weekly routine.

**8 ACCESS ONLINE RESOURCES FOR YOUR CLASS**

Usually these resources have study guides, review questions, flash cards, and concept maps already developed for you. Take advantage of these tools to help you be successful as you study.

- ✓ Students typically only record less than 40 percent of the lecture's main ideas and content
- ✓ Less than half of students review their notes after they have written them

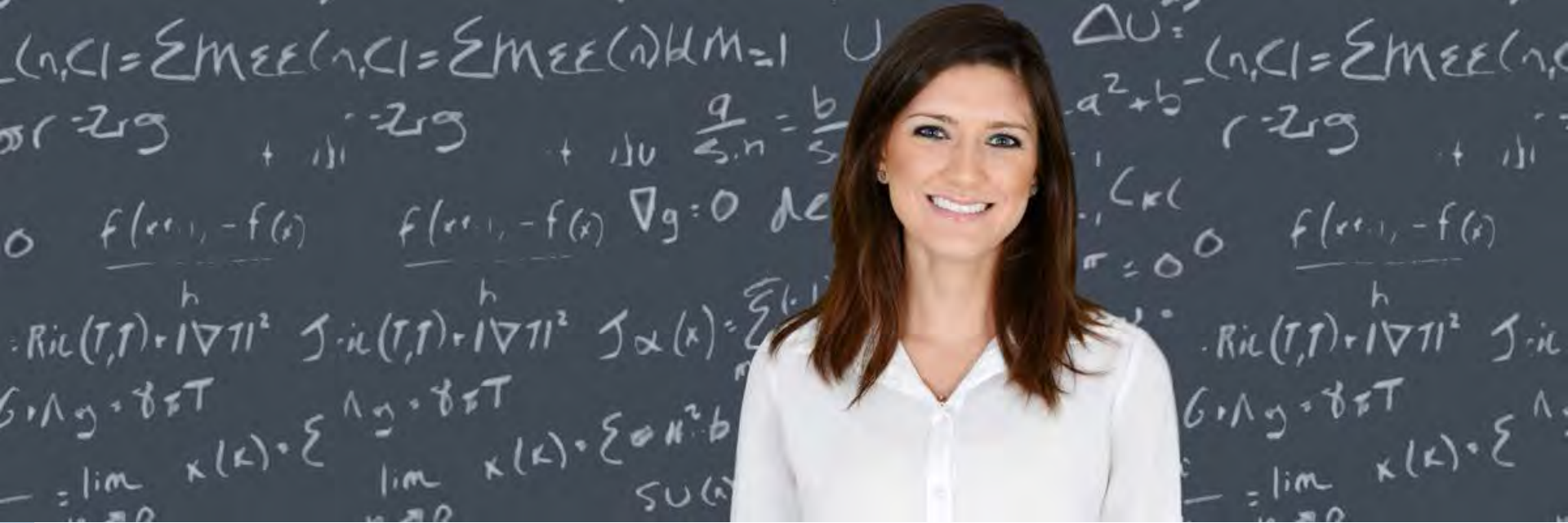
- Create your list...list the tasks you need to accomplish during the day, and map them out on a daily calendar.

## Educator's Toolkit

Section 1003.4156, Florida Statutes, requires students to complete a career and education planning course in sixth, seventh, or eighth grade. The purpose of this webpage is to provide educators with the resources needed for developing and teaching the required course. Schools must use the approved courses to meet the requirement. Some of the approved Middle School Career and Education Planning courses are designated as year-long. In those cases, the classroom teacher can determine which semester to implement the career and education content. The course can be taught by any member of the staff and students must develop a personalized academic and career plan. The [MyCareerShines](#) career planning system is available free of charge to all Florida middle and high schools to assist students in exploring career options and developing an academic and career plan.

Educators assisting middle school students developing high school course plans should use the most recent list of graduation requirements assigned to the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Helpful Academic Advisement Flyers outlining graduation requirements for all cohorts can be found [here](#). See document below for a high school course plan worksheet.

The Educator's Toolkit on Career and Education Planning (provided below) was developed as a resource to assist teachers in planning a comprehensive middle school career course. 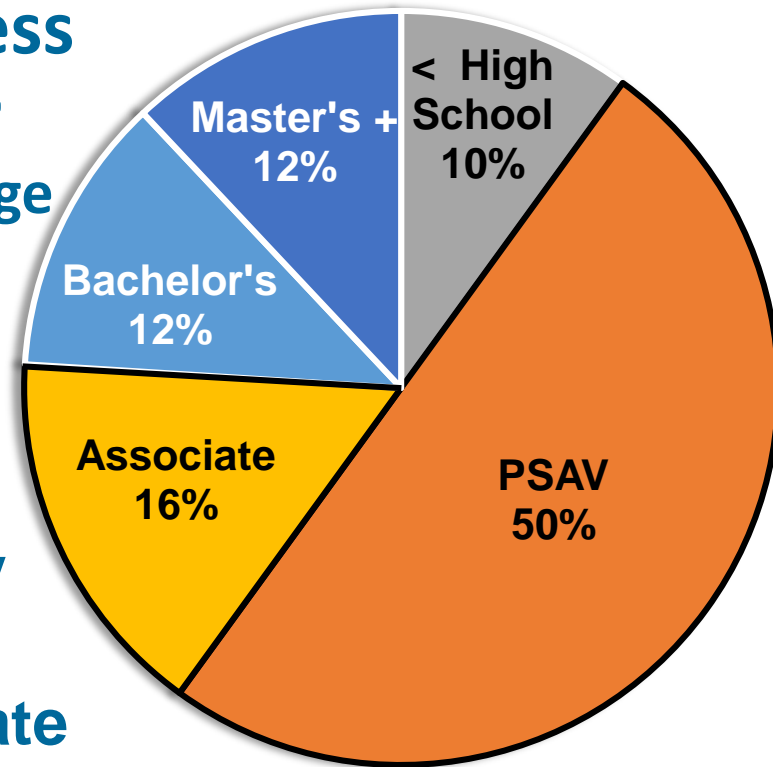

### Students Entering Grade Nine in the 2016-2017 School Year Academic Advisement Flyer—What Students and Parents Need to Know

#### What are the diploma options?

Students must successfully complete one of the following diploma options:

- 24-credit standard diploma
- 18-credit Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning (ACCEL) option
- Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) curriculum
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma curriculum

#### What are the state assessment requirements?

Students must pass the following statewide assessments:

- Grade 10 ELA (or ACT/SAT concordant score)
- Algebra I end-of-course (EOC) and the results constitute thirty percent of the final course grade\* or a comparative score on the Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.)

Students must participate in the EOC assessments, and the results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade\*. These assessments are in the following subjects:

- Biology I
- U.S. History
- Geometry
- Algebra II (if enrolled)

\*Special Note: Thirty percent not applicable if not enrolled in the course but passed the EOC.

#### What are the requirements for the 24-credit standard diploma option?

##### 4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)

- ELA I, II, III, IV
- ELA honors, AP, AICE, IB and dual enrollment courses may satisfy this requirement.

##### 4 Credits Mathematics

- One of which must be Algebra I and one of which must be Geometry.
- Industry certifications that lead to college credit may substitute for up to two mathematics credits (except for Algebra I and Geometry).

##### 3 Credits Science

- One of which must be Biology I, two of which must be equally rigorous science courses.
- Two of the three required credits must have a laboratory component.
- An industry certification that leads to college credit substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology I).
- An identified rigorous computer science course with a related industry certification substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology I).

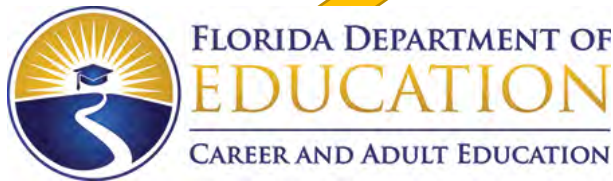
