SENATE BILL NO. 2738

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI CIVIL RIGHTS ACT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE RIGHT OF A PERSON TO BE FREE FROM DISCRIMINATION, BECAUSE OF RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, NATIONAL ORIGIN, IMMIGRANT STATUS, SEX,
- SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY, DISABILITY, OR FAMILIAL
- STATUS IS A CIVIL RIGHT; TO PROVIDE REMEDIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND 5
- FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7
- 8 SECTION 1. For the purposes of this act, the following terms
- 9 shall have the following meanings:
- 10 "Religion" means aspects of religious belief,
- observance, and practice. 11
- 12 (b) "National origin" means an individual's or the
- 13 individual's ancestor's place of origin.
- (c) "Immigrant status" means a representation made by 14
- 15 an individual, or determination made by the appropriate government
- authority, that an individual present in the United States is not 16
- a citizen or national of the United States. This status would 17
- 18 also indicate whether the individual was in the United States with
- 19 or without authorization.

- 21 homosexuality, heterosexuality, or bisexuality.
- (e) "Gender identity" means the actual or perceived
- 23 gender-related identity, expression, appearance, or mannerisms or
- 24 other gender-related characteristics of an individual, regardless
- 25 of the designated sex at birth of the individual.
- 26 (f) "Disability" means a physical or mental impairment
- 27 that substantially limits a major life function. The term does
- 28 not include any of the following:
- 29 (i) Compulsive gambling, kleptomania, or
- 30 pyromania;
- 31 (ii) Current use of illegal drugs or psychoactive
- 32 substance use disorder resulting from illegal use of drugs; and
- 33 (iii) Alcoholism.
- 34 (g) "Familial status" means one or more individuals
- 35 who have not attained the age of eighteen (18) years being
- 36 domiciled with:
- 37 (i) A parent or another person having legal
- 38 custody of the individual or individuals; or
- 39 (ii) The designee of the parent or other person
- 40 having custody, with the written permission of the parent or other
- 41 person.
- The protections afforded against discrimination on the basis
- 43 of familial status apply to any person who is pregnant or is in

- 44 the process of securing legal custody of any individual who has
- 45 not attained the age of eighteen (18) years.
- (h) "Compensatory damages" means damages for mental
- 47 anguish, loss of dignity, and other intangible injuries. The term
- 48 does not include punitive damages.
- 49 (i) "Punitive damages" means damages for malicious or
- 50 heinous and intentional actions or inactions.
- 51 (j) "Employee" means does not include any of the
- 52 following:
- (i) Any individual employed by his or her parents,
- 54 spouse, or child;
- 55 (ii) An individual participating in a specialized
- 56 employment training program conducted by a nonprofit sheltered
- 57 workshop or rehabilitation facility; and
- 58 (iii) An individual employed outside of this
- 59 state.
- 60 (k) "Employer" means a person who employs nine (9) or
- 61 more employees in the state each of twenty (20) or more calendar
- 62 weeks in the current or preceding calendar year, or any agent of
- 63 an employer.
- (1) "Place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage,
- 65 or amusement" means any place, store, or other establishment,
- 66 either licensed or unlicensed, that supplies accommodations,
- 67 goods, or services to the general public, or that solicits or
- 68 accepts the patronage or trade of the general public, or that is

- 69 supported directly or indirectly by government funds. The term
- 70 does not include any of the following:
- 71 (i) Any lodging establishment which contains not
- 72 more that five (5) rooms for rent and which is actually occupied
- 73 by the proprietor of such establishment as a residence;
- 74 (ii) Any private club or other establishment not
- 75 in fact open to the public; and
- 76 (iii) House of worship.
- 77 (m) "Educational institution" means any public
- 78 educational institution, including any academy, college,
- 79 elementary or secondary school, extension course, charter school,
- 80 magnet school, kindergarten, nursery, school district, university,
- 81 professional school, or vocational school.
- 82 **SECTION 2.** (1) The right of an otherwise qualified person
- 83 to be free from discrimination, defined as the denial of equal
- 84 treatment or equal protection to persons in a similar situation,
- 85 because of race, color, religion, national origin, immigrant
- 86 status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, or
- 87 familial status is recognized as and declared to be a civil right.
- 88 This right shall include, but not limited to, all of the
- 89 following:
- 90 (a) The right to obtain and hold employment without
- 91 discrimination.

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- 92 (b) The right to the full enjoyment of any of the
- 93 accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of any place

- 94 of public resorts, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement without
- 95 discrimination.
- 96 (c) The right to engage in property transactions,
- 97 including to obtain housing, without discrimination.
- 98 (d) The right to engage in credit and other contractual
- 99 transactions without discrimination.
- 100 (e) The right to the full enjoyment of any of the
- 101 accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of an
- 102 educational institution without discrimination.
- 103 (2) Any person who is injured by an intentional act of
- 104 discrimination in violation of subsection (1)(b) through (e) of
- 105 this section may file a civil action in a court of competent
- 106 jurisdiction to enjoin further violations, to recover compensatory
- 107 and punitive damages, and, in the discretion of the court, to
- 108 recover the cost of litigation and reasonable attorney's fees.
- 109 (3) (a) (i) Any individual who is injured by employment
- 110 discrimination by an employer in violation of subsection (1)(a) of
- 111 this section may file a civil action in a court of competent
- 112 jurisdiction, which may issue an order prohibiting the
- 113 discriminatory practices and provide affirmative relief from the
- 114 effects of the practices, and award back pay, interest on back
- 115 pay, and, at the discretion of the court, the cost of litigation
- 116 and reasonable attorney's fees; and
- 117 (ii) No liability for back pay shall accrue from a
- 118 date more than two (2) years before the filing of an action.

119	(b) In addition to the remedies under paragraph (a)(i)
120	of this subsection, any individual who is injured by intentional
121	discrimination by an employer in violation of subsection (1)(a)
122	shall be entitled to recover compensatory damages and punitive
123	damages.

- (4) Subsection (1)(a) of this section does not apply to the
 employment of an individual of a particular religion by a
 religious corporation, association, or society to perform work
 connected with the performance of religious activities by the
 corporation, association, or society.
- 129 (5) This act may not be construed to limit any other 130 remedies available under law.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2016.
