### Block of the Month - Becky Trigg

I hope you enjoyed making Sandi Walton's basket blocks 9 & 10. These patterns were emailed to you in July but just in case you need the patterns, they are attached below. Please bring your finished blocks, 9 & 10, to our next meeting to show and enter your name into our participation drawings. We'll have a separate drawing for each block.

If you are behind, this is the time to catch up because you'll want to show your finished quilt top later this year so that you are eligible to win the grand prize. And it is a great one! You can find these patterns and many more by Sandi Walton at [Piecemeal Quilts](#).

**Family Block of the Month: Baskets****Block 9**

10" finished block

**Cutting:****Background:**

Cut (1) 2 1/2" square.

Cut (3) 3 1/2" squares.

Cut (2) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

Cut (2) 4 1/2" squares.

**Sewing:****Handle**

Draw a diagonal line on the back of each 3 1/2" background square, then draw a line 1/4" to each side. These are the sewing lines. Pair background squares with two blue and one yellow 3 1/2" square. With right sides together, sew along the two outer line, then cut along the center line. Press to the dark to form (6) half square triangle units. Trim to 2 1/2" square. Sew together to form two sets for the handles (watch the placement!).

Sew the 2 1/2" background square to the blue side of one of the sets.

**Body**

Draw the diagonal lines on the pink 5 1/2" square. Pair with the red 5 1/2" square, sew, press and trim to 4 1/2" for (2) half square triangle units. You will only use one.

Draw the diagonal lines on the blue 3 1/2" square. Pair with the red 3 1/2" square, sew, press and trim to 2 1/2" for (2) half square triangle units.

Sew a yellow 2 1/2" square to the blue side of the red/blue half square triangle units, watching placement.

Sew these two units to the pink/red HST, following the diagram at the right.

Draw ONE diagonal line on the back of the 4 1/2" background squares. Match the square with the two yellow squares so the diagonal lines runs corner to blue corner. Sew on the diagonal line, then trim to a 1/4" seam and press.

**Base**

Sew the two 2 1/2" red squares to the end of each of the 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" background rectangles. Press to the background - this will help in the final step!

**Basket Assembly**

Sew the shorter handle piece to one side of the body, making sure the half square triangles are going the right direction.

Sew the longer handle piece to the other side, lining up your seam intersection where it meets the other handle piece.

Sew the two base rectangle/square segments to either side of the basket.

Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 4 1/2" square. Align the diagonal with the corners of the red squares that form the base of the basket. This is where pressing to the background helps - you need to line up with the edge of the square in the seam allowance. Sew on the diagonal line (be careful to match the seam intersection point on the other side!) and trim to a 1/4" seam. Press to the background if it's dark enough to hide the colored fabrics, otherwise press to the colors.

**Basket:**

Cut (2) 2 1/2" squares (yellow).

Cut (1) 3 1/2" square (yellow).

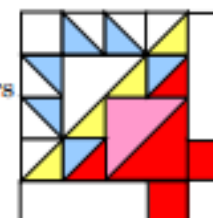
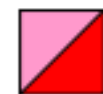
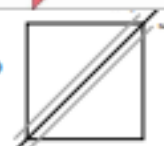
Cut (3) 3 1/2" squares (blue).

Cut (1) 3 1/2" square (red).

Cut (2) 2 1/2" squares (red).

Cut (1) 5 1/2" square (red).

Cut (1) 5 1/2" square (pink).



### Family Block of the Month: Baskots

#### Block 10

10" finished block

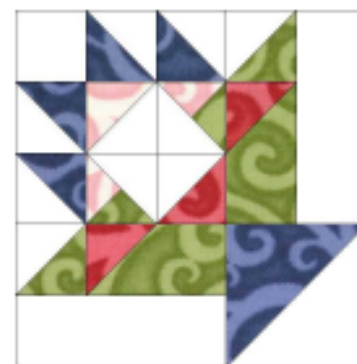
#### Cutting:

##### Background:

- (1) 2 1/2" square.
- (6) 3 1/2" squares.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- (1) 5 1/2" square.

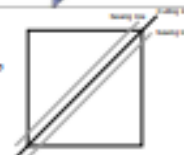
##### Basket:

- Blue: (2) 3 1/2" squares & (1) 5 1/2" square.
- Green: (1) 3 1/2" square, (1) 4" square & (2) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- Red: (1) 3 1/2" square & (2) 2 1/2" squares.
- Pink: (1) 3 1/2" square & (1) 4" square.

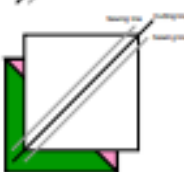


#### Sewing:

Draw a diagonal line on the back of each 3 1/2" background square, then draw a line 1/4" to each side. Pair background squares with two blue and one green, one red and one pink 3 1/2" squares. (You will have one extra background square.) With right sides together, sew along the two outer line, then cut along the center line. Press to the dark to form (10) half square triangle units. Trim to 2 1/2" square. You will not use one red and one pink unit.



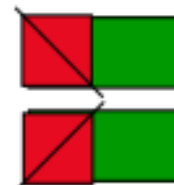
Draw the diagonal lines on one pink 4" square. Pair with one green 4" square, sew and press for (2) half square triangle units. Trim to 3 1/2". Pair each unit with a 3 1/2" background square and sew on the outer lines. Cut along the center line and press to the background. Trim to 2 1/2" square measuring from the center point (use diagonal line on ruler and line up the 1 1/4" lines with the green/pink intersection).



Draw the diagonal lines on the 5 1/2" background square. Pair with the 5 1/2" blue square, sew and press for (2) HST units. Trim to 4 1/2" square. You will only use one.



Draw ONE diagonal line on the red 2 1/2" squares. Pair with the green rectangles, making sure the lines angle opposite directions. Sew a thread to the outside of the diagonal line, press to check that it covers the green, then trim the excess red and green fabric.

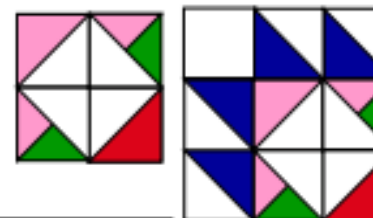


#### Assembly

Sew together the blue HST units to form two sets for the handles (watch the placement!). Sew the 2 1/2" background square to the blue side of one of the sets.



Lay the pink/green/white units, pink/white HST and red/white HST out to form a four patch, then sew together.

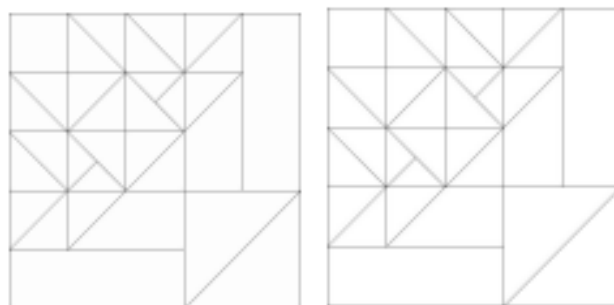
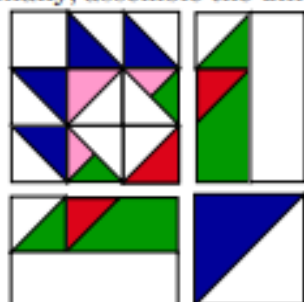


Sew the basket handles to the top and left, watching the angle placement.

Sew the green HST units to the red/green rectangle units, green against red, then sew the background rectangles to the green sides.



Finally, assemble the units to form the block.
