Jim Hall started out as so many other kids do. I bought one of the little balsa gliders, assembled it and promptly crashed it. But, I picked it up and continued to try and got better and better at the little free flight planes. I graduated to rubber powered planes at about age 10. I built many rubber band powered planes as a kid. At about 13 years of age, I started flying control line planes—small planes with the famous Cox .049 engines. Later I graduated to a bigger control line plane with a Super Tiger .35 in it.

At about 15 years of age, cars and motorcycles took over and then a stint in the Air Force along with marriage. When I saw my first RC glider flying, I knew I had to have one. I bought a Gentle Lady and flew it at Rancho San Antonio Park in Los Altos. I learned how to use a high start and got good at finding thermals. However, I had always wanted to fly powered RC planes. After retirement and moving to the Sierra Nevada foothills, I discovered some people flying EC planes at Ready Springs school in Penn Valley. The technology of the electric planes amazed me and got me started in powered RC flying.
