GUIDELINES FOR LENT 2018

For the Archdiocese of Seattle

Ash Wednesday, February 14th, 2018 and Good Friday, March 30th, 2018 are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Additionally,

- Fasting is to be observed by all those eighteen years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their sixtieth birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.
- Abstinence is observed by all those fourteen years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful should undertake these practices seriously and thoughtfully in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

THE CHAIR OF ST. PETER- FEB. 22

A curious feast day occurs on Thursday which is that of the "Chair of St. Peter." Why honor a "chair"? Interestingly it commemorates an actual relic conserved in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City. It represents the "cathedrae apostolorum", indicating authority derived directly from

the apostles. The relic is a wooden throne the back and front of which are trimmed with carved ivory that tradition claims the Apostle Saint Peter used. It signifies the episcopal office of the Pope as Bishop of Rome, an office first held by Saint Peter. Past Popes who formerly used the chair have described it as "a symbol of the special mission of Peter and his Successors to tend Christ's flock and honors the founding of the church in Rome and gives thanks for the work of Saint Peter.
