#### CHAPLAIN'S CORNER...

I believe that I may have addressed this in one of the many earlier editions, but ask yourself this. What is the function of the Post Chaplain?

Many feel that the only function of the chaplain is to attend ceremonies, to open and close them with a prayer. That is only one function. You may be surprised that the chaplain has many more duties. While the Post chaplain can be a local and ordained cleric of faith, many of us are not. In the case of this post I do possess a couple of years of seminary study under my belt.

The primary function of the Post Chaplain is to look after the moral well-being of the post and its members. The chaplain does this while being careful not to promote one faith over another. A chaplain can do certain things that are associated with clerics, but cannot substitute for a cleric. For example, a chaplain cannot inherently marry a couple, due to state laws reserving that duty for ordained clerics and judges of the state. A chaplain can preside over a funeral in the absence of a cleric. The chaplain can conduct ecumenical religious services, such as prayer breakfasts.

The chaplain is also available to the post members to help them through difficult times, and bereavement, upon request. While the chaplain is available for these types of personal services, the chaplain will always yield to those clerics that are ordained, or to secular counsellors that are far more trained.

The chaplain is a vital part to keep the post standing. There are three pillars that support the post. Those that look after the physical structure of the organization. Those that maintain the financial support of the post. The chaplain that supports the spiritual aspect of the post. If one of these pillars should fail, then the other two could not support the organization.

So as you can see, the chaplain is a vital part of the post, and should be utilized where the member sees fit. If you ever have need of my services as your Post Chaplain, please do not hesitate to contact me at 814-280-6647, and I will do my best to render the help that you need.
