



Honoring Our History

It was a year that was! 2020 was one of the most difficult years many of us have faced in our lifetime. Worldwide, people were harassed and threatened for their religious beliefs as well as for the color of their skin. The Pandemic was everywhere and doctors, nurses and other essential workers bravely continued working long, hard hours and days fighting to keep people alive. There was food insecurity as people lost their jobs and even their homes. With several vaccines currently in distribution, science has shown us to never give up hope for a healthier and safer tomorrow.

History has shown us that when faced with terrible times, brave people met the challenge. As a result of their actions, going forward, "Never Again" can be spoken and action taken in our own time.

This month, Honoring Our History is highlighting the [Jewish Resistance Collection](#). This Collection contains a range of materials including underground publications, both printed and mimeographed, by German-Communist and French-Jewish resisters to the Nazi regime before and during WWII. There are international post-war reports (governmental and non-governmental) documenting the persecution and extermination of Jews and the course of several Nuremberg trials, Nazi paraphernalia and contemporary post-war magazine and newspaper articles on Jewish resistance during the Holocaust. Clandestine publications in the collection deal with a range of issues, from major wartime events to the activities of Jewish resistance organizations. One such publication, a German antifascist pamphlet from 1933, is cleverly disguised as an owner's manual for an Electrolux vacuum cleaner. Materials are in various languages: English, French, German, Hebrew, Russian, Spanish and Yiddish.

Preserving, digitizing and describing these materials to make them discoverable is a considerable, multi-layered effort, without which these materials risk permanent deterioration and would be hidden from much of the world's view.







Students Help Shed Light on How COVID-19 Spreads

Undergraduate computer scientists at Brandeis are using machine learning and 3D modeling to add to our understanding of how COVID-19 spreads.

The students are contributing to a Brandeis research effort to map COVID-19's genetic code.

They are working on models to predict the spread of the disease as a means of prevention and are also involved in complementary and collaborative research projects.





