2014 President's Award for Excellence in Law Related Education Recipient

This annual award is given to an outstanding Louisiana elementary, middle or high school teacher who imparts knowledge and understanding of Law and Civic Education and demonstrates the use of interactive learning techniques that make a difference in student learning. Award presentation is a joint partnership of the Louisiana Center for Law and Civic Education and the Louisiana State Bar Association.

Tim Anger, a social studies teacher at Archbishop Hannan High School in Covington, was highly recommended by Charles J. Baird, Archbishop Hannan Social Studies Department Chair. "On a daily basis he shares his love of law and civics with our students through his enthusiasm and his high-spirited classroom lessons. His passion is truly passed on to the students as several students each year realize they would like to pursue law, politics, or become a social studies teacher. Never have I met a teacher who gives 150% one hundred percent of the time," said Baird.

Anger, having taught for 17 years, considers one of the most important aspects of teaching to be the promotion of active civic participation among his students using a variety of teaching strategies and activities. Anger said, "Through the promotion of active civic engagement in my classes and the law related content that I teach, I hope to instill in my students the abilities to not only follow the law, but to have the knowledge and desire to effectively shape it as well."
