When were you last vaccinated?

We understand vaccines and routine health check-ins can easily fall to the wayside. But now is actually a great time to look at your vaccine history and talk to your VA health care provider about which vaccines are right for you.

As a woman, your health changes with time, age, reproductive life stages and overall wellness. Focusing on preventative care with vaccination is important for your well-being.

Don't let the year end without making sure you're up to date on vaccines. It's one of the simplest ways to invest in your health and protect yourself.

As a veteran, you're no stranger to protecting your community. An easy way to continue keeping others safe is by getting vaccinated. If enough people get vaccinated, large outbreaks can be avoided. By getting vaccinated, you're also helping to stop the spread of preventable diseases to others, especially those who cannot be vaccinated because they're too young or have a weakened immune system due to being older or having a serious health condition.

The VA and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend several vaccines based on your age and health. These may include:

Pneumonia: This vaccine can prevent a serious infection in the lungs which can lead to respiratory complications and even death. It is recommended for those aged 65 and older.

Flu: Influenza, or the flu, is a viral condition that can affect anyone but causes more severe sickness in the elderly. The vaccine, needed yearly, can prevent the flu and complications like bacterial pneumonia.

<u>COVID-19</u>: A respiratory illness that spreads easily, COVID-19 can be life-threatening, especially for people with underlying conditions, such as heart disease. This vaccine is recommended for all adults.

Shingles: Shingles is a painful skin rash caused by the same virus as chicken pox. People aged 50 and older should receive this vaccine, which requires two shots, two to six months apart.

<u>Tdap:</u> The Tdap vaccine protects against three diseases, including Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (whooping cough). Most people should get a booster every 10 years.

Hepatitis: Hepatitis is a serious disease caused by a virus which attacks the liver and can cause lifelong infection, cirrhosis (or scarring) of the liver, liver cancer, liver failure and death. The vaccine is recommended for all age groups.

Human papillomavirus (HPV): HPV is a common sexually transmitted infection that spreads through sexual or skin-to-skin contact. It can lead to cervical or vaginal cancer, mouth

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cancer, throat cancer and anal cancer. It is recommended for all people through age 26 and some who are older.


<u>Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV)</u>: The RSV vaccine can prevent lower respiratory tract disease. If you are a veteran who is 60 years or older, talk with your VA health care provider about whether RSV vaccination is right for you.

Vaccines are safe, but they may come with mild side effects including fever, tiredness, body aches or redness, swelling and tenderness where you received your shot. These reactions usually go away within a couple of days. Serious or long-lasting side effects are extremely rare and vaccine safety is continually monitored.

Speak with your VA health care provider about which vaccines are right for you. You can get all the vaccines you need at a VA Medical Center or clinic, which is highly recommended so we can keep your medical files up to date and track your vaccine history for you!

APPLICANTS WHO DO NOT ADHERE TO <u>ALL INSTRUCTIONS</u> WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Applicant Eligibility

- 1. Must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 2. Must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 3. Entries must be submitted by 30 June 2025: NO EXCEPTIONS.

4. Military personnel and veterans MAY NOT APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP.

Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

1. Completed Application.

2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security numbers on high school or college transcripts.

3. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the above topic. The essay must be the applicant's own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence (including a bibliography) of both research and <u>an interview with at least one military woman</u>. Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.

4. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include **separate attachments** for the following:

- (1) Completed Application
- (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
- (3) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.

Application Package Submission DEADLINE is 30 June 2025.

Applicants will be notified in July 2025 of the results.

The scholarship will be paid jointly to the scholarship recipient AND his/her college.


