

The young man sat up. He began to talk. The mother could hardly believe her eyes. Her boy was alive! She knew Jesus always cares for us.


Why were the woman and her friends sad?

Below are pictures of things we have that show how Jesus and our families care for us. Cross out the picture that does not belong in each row. Color the other pictures.


