New insights about Christian Science care at Desert View From the Board President - *Joy Mee*

Over the last almost three years, I have learned that the mental attitude of Christian Science nurses is as important as their physical skills and training. The thought of the nurses about the patient, whether in the room providing care or reflecting on the case away from the patient, is critical to supporting the healing efforts of the patient and practitioner. At Desert View we don't manage pain or accept the inevitability of decline or death. We challenge the material evidence and see the unreality of the material picture. We expect to see progress and know that the patients are capable of praying effectively.

This mental effort is not easy and is something much greater than that expected of staff providing care in a medically based setting. Patients are not drugged to quiet them when suffering. Instead the Christian Science nurses support the prayers of the practitioner and patient to know that matter is not cause or effect. This watchful care requires love, strength, and conviction.

I have visited friends and family members in nursing facilities and hospitals and have seen the difference between spiritually based healing care and medically based care, focused primarily on administering of drugs and material procedures. While this latter care was sincere and skilled in most cases, it did not require the trust in God and mental stamina required in Christian Science nursing care. I am most grateful for our dedicated nursing staff.

Director of Christian Science Nursing - Cindy Snowden

Why do I always use the full title of "Christian Science nurse" every time I want to talk about myself or Christian Science nursing? It is the correct and complete term which protects misunderstanding. It protects us from misrepresentation of who we are and what we do.

Why is this so vitally important in the context of practicing our religion? A RN or Registered Nurse is one who practices in the medical field with years of training in medical procedures. Most people don't know there is a huge difference between an RN and a Christian Science nurse. To not say the whole term is a subtle, but very important omission that would deny the Christ in the nurse's healing work.

The Mother Church gave us a wonderful letter in April 2011, called "Christian Science Nurse, Scope of Services", which begins:

"Christian Science nursing is a practical, spiritual ministry that actively supports the patient's decision to rely on Christian Science healing. It is grounded in the Bible based theology of Christian Science, which includes Christ Jesus' commandment to love one another. (see John 15:12) This ministry is carried out with prayer, wisdom, compassion and skill."

Part of obeying Mrs. Eddy's "Alertness to Duty" in *The Manual of The Mother Church*, for me is not to deny the Christ in my work or as Infinite Life. To nurse without the Christ is not to nurse at all.

A Christian Science nurse does not go to medical nursing school or base care on medical training. We are members of The Mother Church who have excellent training in providing personal hygiene, cleansing and bandaging of wounds, and helping with mobility. This care requires education but not medical classes. We base our proper care on the understanding of how Christian Science heals and on great love. This is what you would want if you had a Christian Science family member or friend whose care needs were beyond your skill level or physical ability.

Everyone who speaks of Christian Science nursing needs to be clear, precise, and legally appropriate as we cherish this beautiful provision of Love to nurture those relying exclusively on Christian Science for healing. Then everyone who hears "Christian Science nurse" knows that we are different and not giving medical advice or care, but that our nurturing (nursing) is based on the theology of Christian Science.
