# This Month at St. Peter's

The month of May is a favorite of mine for many reasons. A few of which are because the entire month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and we have so many little seasons in this month. Why is May consecrated to Mary? Because May is typically the month which Easter, the Ascension and Pentecost fall in and we recognize the Blessed Virgin Mary's participation and witness in these great

This year the month of May hosts quite a few festivals of the Church. During this month we see the culmination of Eastertide in Rogation Sunday, and the short season of Rogation-tide which is the three days of prayer and fasting before the great Feast of the Ascension. We celebrate the Ascension for a week which ends with the Feast of Pentecost on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of May. Within the week of Pentecost, in which we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Disciples and Mary in the upper room, we celebrate the May Ember Days. The Ember Days are the Wednesday (25<sup>th</sup>), Friday (28<sup>th</sup>) and Saturday (29<sup>th</sup>) of the last week of May. These are also days of fasting and prayer for the Church, and specifically for those to be ordained to and in Holy Orders.

The Church calls us to pray especially during the "Merry Month of May." Pray along with us and check out pgs. 175, 177, 179, 180, 261, and 260 of the Book of Common Prayer!

# Did you know?

Did you know that "back in the old days" of the church the Pascal Candle served as a type of clock? Paschal Candles were left burning in the church 24/7 from the Easter Vigil until Ascension Day. By Ascension Day, the candle would have burned all the way down to the decorative cross and the grains of incense. The grains of incense are marked by the "nails" that punctuate the decorative cross. The smoke of the burning incense was symbolic of the Ascension of Christ. Another wonderful tradition of the Paschal Candle is that during the Easter Vigil it was the only flame burning in the village. The faithful had extinguished their kitchen fires during the Triduum (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) and so the New Fire from the Easter Vigil and the Paschal Candle was carried into each home and their stoves and hearths were relit from the Easter fire.
