Appendix E: Storage Tanks

STORAGE TANKS FOR FLAMMABLE MATERIALS:

- 1. As a benefit to the residents of Carshalton-by-the-Bay (C-B-T-B) Subdivision, natural gas is made available to all properties in the subdivision by the Greer City Commission of Public Works (CPW), along with its inherent safety.
- 2. As such, and for the safety of all Subdivision residents, no individual above-ground or below-ground storage <u>tanks</u>, having a volume greater than 30 pounds gas or 10 gallons liquid, may be installed and/or used for storing flammable materials (examples: propane, butane, gasoline, heating oil, etc.).
- **3.** NOTE: No excavation, installations, or connections may be made without the prior approval of the Architectural Control Committee.

STORAGE TAKS FOR NON-FLAMMABLE MATERIALS:

4. Storage Tanks for other than flammable gasses/liquids (example: water storage such as external rain-barrels or other above- or below- ground water storage systems may be approved -- after the property owner submits a written request to the Architectural Control Committee. As a guideline, Rain Barrels may be up to a maximum of 55 gallons but must be approved for architectural appearance.

EXCEPTIONS:

- 5. Requests for Exception to the above policies may be submitted by the property owner to the C-B-T-B Architectural Control Committee, in writing, to include (at a minimum):
 - Full Property Description, to include: Owner's Full Name(s), Address, Lot Number, and points of contact;
 - The specific reason and rationale for using greater sized storage tanks or styles than listed above;
 - A scale drawing of the property and proposed storage tanks (minimum of a scaled "Plat Map") showing the specific location and size(s) of proposed storage tanks in relation to the proposed or existing house.
