Known as the first American 'Patroness of the Arts', Isabella Stewart Gardner (1840-1924) is known for her flamboyant and free-spirited ways. The ambiance of her Back Bay salon on Beacon Street inspired the creation of 'Fenway Court' an architectural lavish backdrop for her significant collection of Italian Renaissance art. Later it was willed to the City of Boston for the 'education and enjoyment of the public forever'. Jessa Piaia will portray Isabella Stewart Gardner; a noteworthy woman. Presentation will last approximately 45 minutes, followed by a Q & A.

Tickets at \$10 per person and Members of the Friends of Borderland are \$8. Children 10 and younger are free. Seating is limited, first-come, first-seated.
