Prayer Challenge

Charles Haddon Spurgeon was born June 19, 1834 in Kelvedon, United Kingdom. By the time he died on January 31, 1892 in Menton, France, he was known as the "prince of preachers". He was a Baptist minister who saw enormous blessings throughout his ministry. Thousands of people came to Jesus Christ through his preaching. He was known to draw as many as 10,000 people at a time!

But Spurgeon never took credit for the success of his ministry. Instead, he always pointed to a VERY specific thing- the hundreds of people who came before worship services and prayed for God's blessing. He consistently said that any success he had came from God in answer to those prayers. He often referred to those prayer groups as the church's "boiler room."

Think about that- one of the preeminent preachers...ever...attributed his success to folks sitting in a room...praying. There is GREAT power in prayer. It is NOT the least we can do- it's the MOST we can do. With that in mind, here's my challenge. I challenge you to spend the next 3 months in prayer. No- I DON'T mean constant prayer! But for the next 3 months, pray for your church. Pray for the new worship service. Pray for the Youth and Children's ministries. Pray for Sunday School and Adult Bible studies. Pray for the 8,000 people in Mercer County who don't have a church home. Pray for...me!

We stand on the threshold of absolutely amazing things. God is moving in powerful ways. How we respond to His call will define where we go from here. And so...we pray. Spurgeon told his fellow pastors, "Brethren, we shall never see much change for the better in our churches in general till the prayer meeting occupies a higher place in the esteem of Christians".

If you are unable to do either of those things, take a moment to say a prayer to God, thanking Him that your dad helped bring you into this world.

So I untwist the cap and begin to chug this "drink" (a term I use loosely). It lived up to its hype and was one of the nastiest things I have ever tasted...a mix of overly flat, syrupy pop with crushed sweet tarts. Yuck!

I finished it in record time, determined not to vomit. I sat there for a few minutes then my nurse broke the silence by saying, "Just breathe." I did NOT realize I was holding my breath as I mapped out some kind of strategy in my mind. God showed me during that moment how I spent parts of my life the same way...just holding my breath.


When a problem arose, I would allow myself to become unnerved and stressed. I refused to relax. I spent time trying to fix it myself. In the center of this chaos, I never pondered the fact that I quit breathing. I was restless.

My attitude was totally contrary to what Jesus tell us. He says in Matthew 11:28, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

He offers and gives us permission to rest! He is calling us to <u>rest in faith</u> knowing His sufficient grace and mercy are more than enough to handle our troubles. He wants us to breathe in His presence. As we take those moments to rest, we can be assured that He has plans for us to prosper and have a hopeful future (Jeremiah 29:11).

It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress, in 1777. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday. Summer Solstice

Have you ever heard of the Summer Solstice and wondered what exactly that was? The word "solstice" derives from a combination of two Latin words: "sol" meaning "sun" and "sistere" meaning "to stand still." As the days lengthen, the sun rises higher and higher until it seems to stand still in the sky. The Summer Solstice marks the longest day (and the shortest night) of the year. In the Northern Hemisphere, Summer Solstice begins on June 20, 2016 at 11:39 AM CDT.


