A Hero Among Us

I've been a member of the NKBMA since 2005. I have met a lot of people and made a lot of friends. When the association was in its infancy, the club would meet and jam out at the GMC dealership off Rt.18. One evening, I started talking to an older gentleman that had a banjo wrapped around his shoulder as I did. We started swapping stories of how much we enjoyed playing the banjo and some songs we were trying to perfect. I really enjoyed talking to him because there were so many guys out there that were out of my league as far as playing banjo, anyway. Little did I know whom I was swapping stories. As time would pass I would come to learn I was talking with a true American hero. The gentleman I am referring to is "Trooper" Bob Williams.

As I continued to stay active in the NKBMA, I started serving on the board with Bob. I was always confused when I heard people call out to "Trooper Bob!" I thought he had been a state trooper policeman before he retired. As we started working on projects together as well as the Sparta Bluegrass festival, I found out the true meaning of "Trooper" and how important Bob is to all of us.

I later found out that Bob actually served in the armed forces as a paratrooper during World War II. It was not until much later that I found out how important his service was and how lucky we are to still have Bob with us.

A while back I was handed a news article that was written about Bob and his service to our country. This article went into a little more detail on what Bob went through one early morning in 1944.

Many of us have seen war movies on TV or stories on the news that depict what men and women go through during war time but I don't think any of us will ever truly know the feeling that you will probably die when you jump out of the plane, even rarer is the courage to go ahead and jump.

One early morning, as Bob explained in the news article, he and many other young men jumped into the skies over Normandy, France as part of Operation Overlord. Bob was the fifth man out of the C-47 as they were flying into enemy fire. As Bob landed in the midst of machinegun fire, he had the sensation he was hit in the leg. As he crawled for cover, he was relieved to find out he had not been shot but later discovered 12 bullet holes in his pants pocket. With four hundred thousand lives lost in World War II, we are lucky to still have Bob with us.

When you hear people of the "Greatest Generation" described, you get a feeling of what they were made of when you hear stories like this. With every year that passes, we lose more and more WWII veterans. Bob has written a book called "Return To Normandy" not only to tell the story as it really happened but make sure that we as a nation never forget the sacrifice that a generation made to keep us all free.

As I think about it they are truly the "Greatest Generation". When I first met Bob, I thought I was just talking to another guy trying to learn the banjo, funny thing is, he would probably tell you that is all he is. It is nice to know that we have an American hero among us and we will always be grateful. Thanks Bob!
