FROM THE PASTOR

As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." Genesis 8:6



It's September! This is my favorite month of the year. There are days when it is still warm enough for me to swim in Silver Lake, but cool enough for me to open the windows and sleep under a blanket. And, then there are the apples! I love apples! As soon as the fresh ones are available, I'm there to pick up a bag and rush home to make applesauce. I usually purchase my apples and my cider at the Cider Mill in Castile, not far from Silver Lake. The Cider Mill has a special place in my heart. The woman who owns it was my daughter's teacher's aide when we lived at Silver Lake. She remembers her, fondly.

Then, and this is even more special, the cider mill is using one of my father's machines. My father founded Tew Manufacturing Corporation in 1954. Tew was my maiden name. He designed and built farm machinery: fruit and vegetable washers, water absorbers, packagers and sizers. The Cider Mill uses one of his machines to wash their apples. Every year, when they open in mid-September, I am there. I purchase apples, cider and their homemade doughnuts. Then I wander into the back barn and stare at my father's machine ... still washing all those apples.

We are living in a time of change. Change can undo us, for we may not know how to cope. Change brings about the necessity of looking at things from a different perspective. We may struggle to find that perspective. Change can provoke emotional reactions in us. We can rebel..stomp our feet, and cling to the "way we have always done things." These reactions do us no good. For change is inevitable. Perhaps we have seen more change in the last few months than might be common. It's unsettling. I would like to remind you that some things never change. I go to the Cider Mill to remind myself of that. There will come a day when my father's machine will no longer work. I know that. But even when that day comes, there will still be apples. And, when other things in life change: like having to wear masks when we leave our homes, the love of God remains constant. There are 330 places in the Bible where the phrase: "The steadfast love of God" is used. I would say that is meant to remind us of something! That something is the UNCHANGEABLE love of God. Just try reading Psalm 36 when you doubt that. Or, Psalm 104. Or any, or all, of the Gospels. It's there ... surrounding us ... and lifting us when we are afraid of falling.

Please do not let change be your undoing. We will get through this, because we have a rock that never changes. Peace be with you, my friends.

Church News:

• Worship Services: Starting Sunday, September 13, 2020, worship services will be in the sanctuary. Hurray!

Of course, it will still be a little bit different in the sanctuary. Some pews will be taped off so we can maintain proper distancing. In addition, each open pew will be "assigned" to our regular churchgoers (so pew bibles and hymnals can be used each week without fear of COVID-19 cross-contamination). Families are encouraged to make their own "family sign" that will be left in "their pew" from week to week. We will also set up seating for guests so that all who visit will feel welcomed. Masks are still going to be required to be worn, but should you wish, you may [softly] sing along with the music.

<u>Goodreads synopsis:</u> For sheer storytelling delight and pure adventure, Treasure Island has never been surpassed. From the moment young Jim Hawkins first encounters the sinister Blind Pew at the Admiral Benbow Inn until the climactic battle for treasure on a tropic isle, the novel creates scenes and characters that have fired the imaginations of generations of readers.

Written by a superb prose stylist, a master of both action and atmosphere, the story centers upon the conflict between good and evil - but in this case a particularly engaging form of evil. It is the villainy of that most ambiguous rogue Long John Silver that sets the tempo of this tale of treachery, greed, and daring.

Designed to forever kindle a dream of high romance and distant horizons, Treasure Island is, in the words of G. K. Chesterton, "the realization of an ideal, that which is promised in its provocative and beckoning map; a vision not only of white skeletons but also green palm trees and sapphire seas." G. S. Fraser terms it "an utterly original book" and goes on to write: "There will always be a place for stories like Treasure Island that can keep boys and old men happy."
