

It may be hard to believe, but Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is actually in February! So, just having

completed the annual meeting but now thinking about Lent, I thought I would revisit the "seven things that I think I have learned about you" that I wrote about in my portion of the annual report. Here's the part I'm thinking of: "Here are seven things that I think I have learned about you during our first six months together:

- 1. You love to spend time in fellowship together (almost as much as you love coffee!)
- 2. Fishing, hunting, and spending time outdoors is an important part of this community's life.
- 3. Connections among the wider community, from the closest family connections to the "sister's best friend's husband's aunt" connections, are important to you.
- 4. Supporting local community organizations is one important way that you love your neighbor. You also maintain these relationships by inviting their leaders to speak once a month (what a great practice!)
- 5. You show a commitment to this congregation's life even when it would be easier not to bake all those baked goods or step out the door when it's 20 below!

- 6. You show both a love for your past and an openness to your future.
- 7. Most importantly, you love one another, and you trust in God's promises."

Now, with Lent coming up, we have a chance to build on our strengths with (one of my favorite words) **intentionality.** Intentionality is about putting into practice what God calls us to – and really making a point of it (rather than, as is all too easy for me at least, just simply trying a little here and there and hoping for the best!)

Since the early church, Lent has been a season of Baptismal preparation for Holy Week and the three days (Good Friday, Easter Vigil, and Easter!). So Christians have turned to intentional practices – prayer, fasting, love of neighbor, dwelling in scripture - for two thousand years. Sometimes, people try to give something up for Lent -a noble idea, and worthy of consideration. But allow me to suggest something else: perhaps Lent can be a time to try to add a practice, with some intentionality. Or, if you do choose to give something up, perhaps you might consider adding something to take it's place - for example, I might consider giving up facebook scrolling for 10 minutes and replace that time with praying a psalm or walking outside.

So with that in mind, here are seven suggestions for intentional practices that you might consider taking up during the six weeks of Lent:

- 1. Invite someone you don't know, or don't know well, to have coffee or lunch with you. See how much you can find out about their story.
- 2. Spend time each day walking walking in silence, or in conversation with a partner, can both be a form of prayer!
- 3. Reconnect with one person that you've lost touch with (maybe even one every week?)
- 4. Give a small amount each week or day to an organization that matters to you or is doing God's work.
- 5. Pray each day for our church both here in Carlton and across the world.
- 6. Write in a journal every day (this can also be a form of prayer!)
- 7. Read through one Gospel from beginning to end. We're reading Luke this year, although Mark is the shortest if that helps. I prefer reading with a study Bible, but any version will do!

As you read this, you still have a few weeks until Ash Wednesday. May the upcoming season of Lent, and all the days until then, be a blessing to you and to your neighbor.

# Servant of Christ Award: Nominate a Remarkable Congregation

Faith communities across Minnesota have always been important partners in LSS' mission to serve our neighbors. Congregations have hosted office space, provided homemade meals, sewn quilts and masks, welcomed refugees, and contributed in so many unseen ways to their communities.

Each year, LSS recognizes partnering congregations that are leaders in social ministry and social justice in their community, have a connection to LSS services in their area, and faithfully provide financial support for the service ministry of LSS. Nominate a single congregation – or congregations in partnership – in service of their neighbors. Nominate a congregation for the LSS Servant of Christ Award by Monday, January 31.

### **Resources for Lent**

The season of Lent begins on March 2. This season of intentional study and introspection may be perfectly suited to engage one of these <u>resources</u> – provided by LSS as free digital downloads. These are a few we wish to highlight in 2022:

- Rebuilding Bethany is a Bible study written for the Advent season that can also be used during Lent for individual or small group study. This resource provides an understanding of the journey of children and their families experiencing crisis and the generous response of neighbors in Duluth and the northeast region of Minnesota.
- Not Even One Night helps raise awareness about youth homelessness. Use this five-week study for adult education, a Lenten study and preaching aid, confirmation study, or any way that works best for your congregation.
- Safe and Healthy Relationships is a four-session guide for middle school and high school youth, to be used in confirmation classes and youth groups. The interactive sessions guide youth in understanding how they can engage in healthy friendships and dating relationships all while reinforcing their value as a child of God.
