REFLECTION for the Sixth Sunday of Easter

As we draw nearer to the Feast of Pentecost and the end of the Great Ninety Days- 40 days of Lent and 50 days of Easter, our scripture readings focus on the coming of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. God, in this form, will accompany us as we live faithfully our life's journey. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that we should never be troubled or afraid- 'My peace I give to you.'

God, the Father, is in heaven. Jesus, God the Son, is about to ascend into heaven to sit at His Father's right hand. Now dawns the advent of the Trinity's third Person, God the Holy Spirit. Again, if we read the words of today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that 'the Holy Spirit will teach you everything, and remind you of what I have said to you- my promises, my Way of living, my Love.' Do we believe this? Do we live our lives in firm and confident belief that God is with us? Do we have the good sense to turn to God in prayer each morning when we wake- to praise God, to 'put our lives in God's hands', and to seek God's blessing on our day's many tasks? Do we have the good sense to turn to God before we go to sleep each night to thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit and our Guardian Angel, to ask for a good night's sleep, and to ask to see tomorrow whether we see it here on earth or see it in the joys of heaven- our eternal home?

If we believe this, then God is calling us to an <u>abandonment to hope</u>. What is that? Well, as I see it, it is an empting of ourselves, a purging of our pride, our self-centeredness, and our insistence in 'doing it my way.' It is, to use a popular phrase-<u>letting go and letting God</u>.

It is difficult to abandon our natural human ways, to let go and to trust in the Divine. We are conditioned to self-preservation. Watch an animal when it is cornered to see the truth of this. What makes us different from them is our divinely infused soul. And it is in that soul that the Holy Spirit finds a home. The Spirit dwells within us ever-ready to <u>'teach us everything</u>.'

Isn't it a great sustaining and comforting feeling, a blessed assurance, to know that the Holy Spirit is at our beck and call, it is a free life saving gift from God, indeed the gift is God.

All throughout Easter we have been reading about the first disciples of Jesus. They had such boldness about them. They were beaten, flogged, and ridiculed, but they persevered in their work of evangelizing the Gentiles. How easily they could have given up under such persecution; but they persevered. They believed in the words and the hope Jesus had proclaimed.

They did so because they were convinced that their call was to <u>abandonment to hope</u>. There hope was in the Lord. The Spirit was their guide; they succeeded marvellously. And so can we!!
