

The by-laws committee would like to thank all of the members who submitted proposed changes to the Westminster Elks By-laws. Below we have stated how the by-laws currently read and the suggested and recommended revisions. We will be voting on the by-laws during the regular Lodge meeting on June 23rd. It is encouraged to have all members present as these by-laws are what we all abide by. If you have any questions, please contact PER Brynn Short at brynnshort@hotmail.com or 303-884-2104. Please note that the underlined and bold text are what the committee is suggesting or recommending as the revisions.

Article V, section 1, reads: The elective officers of this Lodge shall be an Exalted Ruler, an Esteemed Leading Knight, an Esteemed Loyal Knight, an Esteemed Lecturing Knight, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Board of Trustees consisting of 5 members and a Tiler.

Recommended revision: the removal of "and a Tiler". Revision would read: The elective Officers of this Lodge shall be an Exalted Ruler, an Esteemed Leading Knight, an Esteemed Loyal Knight, an Esteemed Lecturing Knight, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Board of Trustees consisting of 5 members.

Article V, section 4, under of the Secretary reads: The position of the Secretary shall be a full time position of forty hours per week with the hours to be posted, with two weeks paid vacation per year, and six (6) major paid holidays off.

Recommended revision: removal of full time position of forty hours per week. Revision would read: The duties of the secretary should be completed in full, with flexible hours posted; with two weeks paid vacation per year, and six (6) major paid holidays off.

Article V, section 6, under of the Tiler reads: ... For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$75.00 per annum, payable yearly.

Suggested revision: changing sum to \$85.00. Revision would read:...For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$85.00 per annum, payable yearly.

Recommended revision: remove compensation.

Article V, section 2, under of the Exalted Ruler reads: ... Transportation cost for the out of Metro area Conventions, may be reimbursed by mileage allowance of thirty five cents (.35 cents) per mile.

Recommended revision: removal of transportation costs.

Article V, section 2, under of the Exalted Ruler: recommended addition: If any officers are unable to attend the State Convention or the Quarterly Conventions, then it is the duty of the Exalted Ruler to grant permission of any eligible officer or committee chairperson to attend said quarterlies in replacement of absent officer.

(this addition would be added at the end of Article V, section 2)

Article V, section 3, under of the Esteemed Leading, Loyal and Lecturing Knights reads: ... Transportation cost for the out of Metro area Conventions, may be reimbursed by mileage allowance of thirty five cents (.35 cents) per mile.

Recommended revision: removal of transportation costs.

Article V, section 4, under of the Secretary reads:... Transportation cost for the out of Metro area Conventions, may be reimbursed by mileage allowance of thirty five cents (.35 cents) per mile.

Recommended revision: removal of transportation costs.

Article V, section 7, under of the Trustees or Board of Directors reads: . . . It shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, or their Designee, to attend three (3) quarterly meetings and State Convention when possible . . .

Recommended revision: Having 1st year Trustee attend quarterlies and state convention. Revision would read: It shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and 1st year Trustee, or their Designee, to attend three (3) quarterly meetings and State Convention when possible...

Article V, section 6, under of the Tiler: recommended change of transferring to Article VI section 8.

Article VI: Appointive Officers and Duties section 1 reads: . . . the Exalted Ruler-elect shall appoint an Esquire, a Chaplain, an Inner Guard, an Organist, and Vocalist . . .

Recommended revision: add "and a Tiler" revision would read: . . . the Exalted Ruler-elect shall appoint an Esquire, a Chaplain, an Inner Guard, an Organist, a Vocalist, and a Tiler . . .

Article VI: Appointive Officers and Duties section 2 under of the Chaplain and Inner Guard: recommended change of attending Quarterlies and State Conventions would read: Upon presentation of valid receipts, and acknowledgement of attendance at the State Convention and Quarterly meetings, the Lodge will pay the following:

- 1. Registration and Banquet fees.
- 2. For meetings within 75 miles of the Metro Area, room accommodations as follows:
  - a. Quarterly Conventions one (1) night
  - b. Annual State Convention two (2) nights
- 3. For meetings outside 75 miles of the Metro Area, room accommodations as follows:
  - a. Quarterly Conventions two (2) nights
  - b. Annual State Convention: two (2) nights

Article VI: Appointive Officers and Duties Section 3 under of the Esquire: recommended change of attending Quarterlies and State Conventions would read: Upon presentation of valid receipts, and acknowledgement of attendance at the State Convention and Quarterly meetings, the Lodge will pay the following:

- 1. Registration and Banquet Fees
- 2. For meetings within 75 miles of the Metro Area, room accommodations as follows:
  - a. Quarterly Conventions one (1) night
  - b. Annual State Convention two (2) nights
- 3. For meetings outside 75 miles of the Metro Area, room accommodations as follows:
  - a. Quarterly Conventions two (2) nights
  - b. Annual State Convention: three (3) nights

Article VI: section 6, under of the Organist reads: . . . He shall receive as compensation for actual attendance at each session, regular or special, as well as each social session when his services are required, the sum of \$75.00 per year, payable annually.

Suggested revision: changing sum to \$85.00. Revision would read: . . . He shall receive as compensation for actual attendance at each session, regular or special, as well as each social session when his services are required, the sum of \$85.00 per year, payable annually.

Recommended revision: removal of payment.

Article IX: Home, Club or other Facility Section 1 item (a) reads: A House Committee consisting of 5 members, to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

Recommended revision: changing 5 to 9. Revision would read: A House Committee consisting of 9 members, to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

Westminster Elks Lodge #2227 House Rules Preamble.

Item 6, reads: . . . Hats will not be allowed in the dining room, Upstairs or Frey Hall, without the approval of the Lodge floor, for special events only.

Recommended revision: . . . Hats will not be allowed in the dining room, Upstairs or Frey Hall, without the approval of the Lodge floor, for special events only or by permission of the Exalted Ruler.

Item 21, reads: Elks are allowed to bring guests. Some guests over the age of 21 shall be allowed only three (3) visits, without making an application for membership.

Recommend revision: changing to 3 visits a month. Revision would read: Elks are allowed to bring guests. Same guests over the age of 21 shall be allowed only three (3) visits a month, without making an application for membership.
