RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING  
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING  
September 20, 2017

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Wes Howell and Guy Bakke. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Police Chief Scott Spade, and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

CRANDALL MOVED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES AS PRESENTED. HOWELL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM SEPTEMBER 7, 2017 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 20, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$59,657.39. HOWELL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The committee that was working on regulations for storage containers, came before the board. Erik Woog, Dennis Carpenter, Dave Hammer, Shane Bodemann, and Jeff Miller were all present on behalf of the committee. They have met several times, and have come to the conclusion, after spending time looking at various storage containers around town, that weeds are a bigger issue at this point. Chief Spade noted that the person the town was going to hire for code enforcement took a job elsewhere, and his police officers have had a higher than normal case load, which did not allow them to do much code enforcement. Woog felt that if the town took the opportunity to mow more of their own right of ways, it may encourage others to do the same thing. Chief Spade will start working on more code enforcement, starting with the main highways through town.

The Mayor reported

- He attended a strategic action planning group meeting.
- He and Manager Campbell attended the annual County Technical Services meeting for the Town's health insurance, and there will be a 1% increase for health, no increase for vision or dental insurance.

The Police Chief reported:

- They have been completing pre-trial preparation and interviews for the upcoming trial. Officer Jones will be working the day shift while the trial is taking place.

The public works director was not present, but Manager Campbell noted the divers were at the reservoir on Monday. The work has not been done, and just in case they find something more extensive, Manager Campbell will be budgeting money to cover the work, should there be any that needs to be done. The town has ordered a crack sealing machine, and there is also work going to be done on the pump station.

The Manager Reported:

- The new wayfinding signs have been installed.
- The recent sales tax report shows the town is only down 1.12% from 2016.
- He located the lease agreement with the chamber, and all board members were given a copy.
- He will have the preliminary budget presentation at the next meeting.
- He attended the limited gaming impact advisory committee meeting last week.
