HUNTLEY PRESBYTERIAN CEMETERY SCHEDULE 'A' DEFINITIONS

Burial (Full):	The opening and closing of an in ground lot or plot for the disposition of human remains in a casket.
Burial (Cremation):	The opening and closing of an in ground lot, plot or columbarium for the disposition of human remains in a sealed urn.
By-Laws	The rules and regulations under which the Cemetery operates.
Care and Maintenanc	The Fund: As required under the FBCA a percentage of the purchase price of all Interment Rights and set amounts for marker and monument installations is contributed in this provincially controlled fund. Interest earned from this fund is used by the cemetery to provide care and maintenance of plots, lots, markers and monuments at the Cemetery. The percentage is kept in trust by the Province of Ontario to maintain the cemetery in perpetual care.
Cemetery Operator:	For the purposes of this by-law, the Trustees of the Huntley Presbyterian Cemetery are referred to as the Cemetery Operator.
Contract:	For purposes of these by-laws, all purchasers of interment rights must sign a contract with the cemetery detailing obligations of both parties and acceptance of the cemetery by-laws.
Corner Stones:	Shall mean any stone or other land markers set flush with the surface of ground and used to indicate the location of a lot or plot.
FBCSA:	Provincial governing Act; Funeral Burial & Cremation Services Act.
Grave:	(Also known as Lot) means any in-ground burial space intended for the interment of a child, adult or cremated human remains.
Interment Right:	The right to require or direct the interment of human remains or cremated human remains in a grave, lot, niche or crypt and direct the associated memorialization.
Interment Rights Cer	tificate: The document used by the Cemetery to the purchaser once the interment rights have been paid in full, identifying ownership of the interment rights.

Interment Rights Hol	der: Any person designated to hold the right to inter human remains in a specified lot.
Lot:	For the purposes of these By-Laws a lot is a single grave space (i.e 4' x 8')
Marker:	Shall mean any permanent memorial structure that is set flush and level with the ground and used to mark the row of a burial lot.
Monument:	Any permanent memorial projecting above the ground installed within the designated space to mark the location of a burial or lot (i.e. a memorial, headstone or plaque).
Niche:	An individual compartment in a columbarium for the entombment of cremated human remains.
Plot:	A parcel of land, sold as a single unit containing multiple lots.
Scattering:	Shall mean the act of spreading cremated remains over a designated area within a cemetery.
