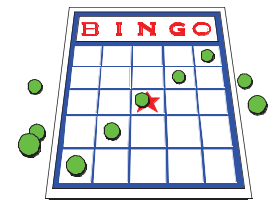

Trustees corner

Some insights on what your Trustees do

Welcome to the Trustees' Corner! In the coming months this section will give you some insights into the types of things the Puyallup Aerie Trustees are working on.

There have been several questions about who the Trustees are and what they do. There are five Trustees that meet every Wednesday at 5 p.m. in the poker room above the main entrance to the Aerie. Anyone is welcome to come to a Trustees' Meeting, although you may get asked to leave at some point if we are discussing sensitive topics.

In general, the Trustees run the business of the Aerie. They are responsible for setting business policies for the Aerie. These include: overseeing the operations of the kitchen and bar, authorizing raffles and fund-raisers, authorizing posters and materials that are posted on the walls, overseeing employees of the Aerie, along with many other business topics, such as implementing pour spouts in the bar.

The Trustees are also responsible for disciplinary action of Aerie members. If a member has done something against the Aerie rules, the Trustees can reprimand the member either verbally, through a formal letter or in egregious case, remove the member from the roles for up to 90 days.

We oversee the Aerie budgets and profit and loss

statements.

The Trustees are elected by the Aerie members for either a one or two year term. We take our responsibility very seriously as we strive to make Daffodil Aerie #2308 a fun place to go. A healthy, prosperous business allows the Aerie to have the money to do its community service of charitable donations. In the coming months, The Trustees' Corner will introduce a different Trustee each month.

Please make note that comfort animals or pets are not allowed in Daffodil Aerie #2308. The only animals allowed are Service Animals that have documentation and that perform a medical service to their handler. If you bring a service animal to the Aerie, be prepared to show the papers associated with it and answer some questions regarding specifically what role the service animal plays. Without these, you will be asked to remove the animal.

As always, if you have questions, concerns or comments, please drop them into the suggestion box located on the south wall of the entrance hall. If you wish a response, be sure and put your name, contact information and Grand Aerie ID number. All communications are private and your name will not be shared with anyone.
