As you know, we are moving to interim quarters at First Friends of Whittier. We will be in our building for Purim and the Friday night service on March 22nd. We will bring in our Bimah and a new Aron Kodesh, made for us in Israel which will hold two or three Torahs and has a Ner Tamid attached. Negotiations are ongoing for a permanent location in Whittier. The week of March 25th will be moving week and will find us between the two locations. Our furnishings will actually be moved on March 27th. Some will go to storage and some to our interim facility. Sunday March 24th will be a working party day. We will be taking the lighter things off the walls, packing our religious items and being sure that things are tagged properly and we haven't forgotten anything. Any and all help will be greatly appreciated. A few hours of your day, if you can spare it, would be great. Moral Predicament

Our Torah provides us the insight to solve moral dilemma, an example is contained in the story of Judah and Tamar. (BEREISH 38:1-30)

Background

Judah's two eldest sons were evil sinners and were slain by G-d. Judah promised to Tamar his youngest son, Shelah in marriage when he was grown up. Thus satisfying the duty of a husband's brother in order to perpetuate his dead brother's name in Israel.

In time Shelagh the wife of Judah died and Judah was comforted at Shiva by his friend Herah, concisely, when Tamar saw that Shelah was an adult; she was not given to be his wife.

Action

On completion of Shiva, Tamar

learned that Judah and Herah were going to shear sheep in Timnah. With this information on hand Tamar changed clothes and posed as a harlot on the way to Timnah. Judah had intercourse with Tamar who wisely offered her services to him for collateral payment of his seal, staff, and cord. These played a dramatic move on behalf of Tamar as she was accused not of prostitution, but adultery. The collateral proved Judah was indeed the father of twins, Perez and Zerah. Judah admits to being their father, and acknowledges that Tamar is right; meaning he should have married her off to his son Shelah into levirate marriage.

Results

Question: Was the deception and sly action by Tamar justified?

Answer: Yes! For two reasons:
Judah admitted Tamar was far more
righteous than he since he failed to
keep his promise to give his son
Shelah to her in levirate marriage.

The second reason is found in that Judah may have eventually married Tamar off to Shelah because Shelah named his first son ER (ICRON 4:21) thus stating that he had entered a levirate marriage to produce an heir (continued on next page...)

for his deceased childless brother.

Twins

Concerning the twins, Perez, the younger twin is a progenitor of King David (Ruth 4:18-22)

This was G-d's plan that give us useful words of advice: The only people rejected by G-d are those deprived of a moral sense of power to distinguish between right and wrong; truth and lies; beauty and ugliness; cruelty and mercy.

As long as we remain an ethical, and moral people that thwart the purposes of the wicked,

we shall continue to live an feel G-ds ever present love for us!

When you face a dilemma, remember the above and ask this question, "What would G-d do?" HASHEM always has a plan!


