FEATHERS IN THE WIND

Recently a discussion was begun how certain Amana villages have taken words and either made them sound more "English" or just seemed to identify these words with the town they are from.

One could say that most people from the certain towns seems to have come from the same part of what is now Germany or a certain province.

It has been over 90 years that the "Great Change" took place so, unless you are linguist you might not recognize certain words or dialects of and area especially since the migration from Europe took place in 1842.

I have taken a few words and just written them down for you to "translate" the way YOU think of it. I have also taken these words and given it to a special person who is a linguist for help. I hope that you WRITE back to me and tell ME or words or phrases that you might have recalled as you grew up in the Amanas

Naturally I will start with the word, Mittler." There is really nothing wrong with the name or the way it is spelled although some of us do have different translations as to what it means.

This brings me to how would people draw a difference between Upper and Lower South Amana. I would lump the two villages together and simply say, "Suedder," but is that correct if I am referring to a family in lower or upper South Amana?

My mother would often refer to a bug by calling if a "Leller Esel." I never really knew exactly to what bug she was referring to except that it lived near a cellar or a moist place."

In Middle people, would often refer to jam or jelly as "Shallae (pronounced with a long a). The rest of the community would say, "Schmerzel." I apologize if I misspelled that word, but I could not find the correct word in the dictionary...perhaps because it is an older word.)

Then there were a number of words that seemed to have French origins because quite a few of the Amana people came from southern Germany that bordered on to France.

An example of this "Sallier" which comes comes from the French word "Rewereaebe Spallire."

The one that Charlemagne always finds amusing is "Eich Hass." Is realy "Eichoernchen.'

Charlemagne or should I say his cousin, Barbara Ruedy Jorgenson, would always make fun of people in Homestead when we pronounced" OUR way of paring knife. I suppose the rest of the Amanas would refer to it as a "Schelmesser, but we in Homestead would say it was a "Risemeser." (Again I apologize for the spelling because I cannot find it any of German dictionaries probably because the word is antiquated.

To us, in Homestead, it meant to "prepare" and not to cut our wrists.

I of course love the word, "Mist," but find that in this day and age it would be dunge.

No matter what there are days when I lapse into "Kolonie Deutsch" and feel as if I have become a young girl again with all my friends that have gone before me. It is sort of like wrapping oneself into a warm and comfortable quilt which I sincerely hope people will remember.
