Subject: RRT - Comprehensive Update~ Arriving Buses and Volunteer Opportunities

We have been sending updates with a lot of one-off asks and opportunities. After our conversation at the Refugee Response Team (RRT) meeting last week, I want to provide a comprehensive update about the buses arriving from Texas and Arizona and ideas on how to support this effort. Included will be specific ways you and your parish can get involved in small and large ways. Before I get into the buses...

There is an immediate need from LSSNCA. Please pass it on to those who might be interested.

IMMEDIATE NEED: One immediate opportunity is available with Lutheran Social Services for volunteers at Legal Clinics to help Afghan Allies apply for asylum. Volunteers with and without legal experience are needed immediately. The information is here: Offer Pro Bono Legal Assistance (Issnca.org)

CURRENT STATE - ARRIVING BUSES

Since April, asylum seekers have been arriving at Union Station on buses from Texas and now Arizona sent by their governors. Many of those arriving are making their way to family or friends around the country; others have no connection and nowhere to go.

A coalition of local volunteers and organizations came together to raise funds to be able to provide transportation, temporary housing, phones, food, clothes, and support to people arriving with virtually nothing. There has been minimal publicity about this effort for a couple of reasons including a desire for safety for those arriving and not to bring attention to a political stunt. More publicity is happening because of the large volume of support needed and the publicity needed to get resources.

Local faith communities have provided respite centers for those arriving so they can have something to eat, rest, clean up, get clean clothes, and move to their next destination. The faith communities currently serving as physical respite centers on different days during the week include: Church of the Brethren/Hill Havurah, Friends Meeting of Washington, Capitol Hill United Methodist Church, Foundry United Methodist Church, Lutheran Church of the Reformation, New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, St. Thomas Parish, St. Stephen and the Incarnation, and Calvary. More locations are needed. This work requires incredible stamina, flexibility, and MANY hands and resources.

Buses are now coming to Montgomery County, MD under the work of the Faith Advisory Council of Montgomery County. Resources listed below may be used across both DC and MoCo.

DC Mayor Bowser has been under pressure to support/partner with this effort but has called this a federal issue. With the change in the immigration policies on the border, we anticipate the number of arriving folks and buses will continue to grow. The additional buses are arriving at varying times during the day and night which creates many challenges.

Donations of Goods:

• Clothing: Many of those arriving only have the clothes on their backs. St. Thomas is gathering clothing such as NEW underwear and socks for men and women. Men's pants in excellent shape in sizes 26-34 with an inseam between 28-32 are especially needed. Most of those arriving are small physical stature. Women's clothing in excellent shape is needed,

- again for women small in stature. Shoes for men and women sizes 6-8 are needed. You can connect with Carol Coonrod at cscoonrod@gmail.com to make arrangements for dropping off clothing or having it sent. The clothing will be used at respite centers.
- **Bags** totes with zippers, backpacks, etc. which will be used for carrying goods on buses and planes or to their next destination. You can connect with Carol Coonrod at cscoonrod@gmail.com to make arrangements for dropping them off or having it sent.
