Our guest speakers in June were Senator Jim Mathias and Delegate Mary Beth Carozza. Each spoke of the many concerns relating to seniors in the state of Maryland as well as the impact of new leadership with



Larry Hogan as governor, 50 republicans on board and the advance and impact of budget cuts. Senator Mathias spoke of Larry Hogan's strong business background, his understanding of big government and his formula for senior programs. He acknowledged the strong growth in Ocean City over the years in its people, buildings, monetary base, business and relationships. As he explained details of the legislative process he alluded to the budget cuts that


normally occur and the solid business explanation that must be provided during this session to protect the \$131,000 grant to MAC. Formerly there was a 27% reduction in services proposed for MAC which would impact many issues for OC seniors even as this population grows in our town. His goals and those of Delegate Carroza were outlined and included pension protection, healthcare, tax deductions, senior citizen protection, jobs and the environment. Delegate Carroza spoke to other Eastern Shore initiatives such as those concerning agriculture and farming, work with the Army Corp of Engineers related to dredging of waterways to ensure safe passage of commercial fishing vessels and initiatives to promote tourism working with non-Federal partners in the town of OC and the State of Maryland.


