## Parents:

Your child attended a presentation today at school about our award-winning Band program. This brochure includes helpful information about how to get started in the Band program. It contains the answers to many common questions about Band in the Boardman Schools.

Students and Parents: Very soon, while you are still in fourth grade, you will get to choose which music class you wish to take next year in middle school. We hope you will choose
BAND. Please take a few minutes to go over the information presented here and do not hesitate to contact us to ask any questions.

- Band is the largest, most popular co-curricular activity in the Boardman Schools.
- Band in Boardman is a nationally recognized, award-winning program. Boardman Bands have performed at Carnegie Hall, the Tournament of Roses Parade, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, and many other important national events. In 2004, the Spartan Marching Band had the honor of performing for the President of the United States.
- Band has been proven to
 enhance the learning of math, science, reading, and history. Playing a musical instrument is the best way to learn music, and students have fun in the process.
- Band is structured to reinforce teamwork, responsibility, work ethic, and problem-solving skills valued by employers and colleges.
- Band offers the most variety. There are many instruments from which students can choose (see INSTRUMENT CHOICES). Band students can ultimately play in the most different ensembles including Jazz and Pep Bands.
- Band is not expensive. Large school-owned instruments can be rented for only $\$ 40$ per year. Smaller instruments are relatively easy to find and can be rented from local music stores. If you buy an instrument, look for a quality instrument from a reputable music store.
- Band is not difficult. Band instruments are relatively easy to play. Our approach in 5th grade band is step-by-step.
- Band is taught during the school day so students can participate in sports, cheerleading, and other activities - even in high school.
- Orthodontics do not interfere with band. Hundreds of Boardman Band students wear braces.
- Band can help students get college scholarships, even for non-music majors.

Drums** and Bells (includes bells, xylophone, chimes, marimba. This is an excellent choice for piano players).

* The brass section is one in which we always need more
 players, especially French horn, trombone, baritone, and tuba.
** There has been such interest in drums that we are forced to limit the number of students accepted into this section. Acceptance will be based on a test that will measure the student's aptitude for rhythm, coordination, and music reading skills. Students interested in drums must have a second instrument choice.

Guitar and Piano - Although we don't teach guitar and piano in beginning band, students who play them will have opportunities to do so in middle school Jazz Ensembles. We use guitar and piano every day in Marching Band and high school Jazz Ensembles.

## * * IMPORTANT * *

Students do not need to make a final instrument choice now. They only need to decide if they want to be in band, orchestra, or chorus. Band Staff will meet with those students who select band before the end of the school year to let everyone try the different instruments. An instrument selec-
 tion can be made at this time. There will also be at least one Instrument Fair at the high school during the summer.


Students who play French horn, baritone, or tuba should rent the instrument from the school. They will be assigned two instruments for one rental fee - one to use at school and one to keep at home.

## PRIVATE LESSONS

Although the band staff is very well-equipped to teach all of the above instruments, it is nearly impossible to give so many students the individual attention and instruction which is so important. That is why we highly recommend private instrument lessons with a qualified instructor. The summer after fourth grade is an excellent time to find a good private teacher and begin lessons.
