
Some of our new members may not know....

The 2014 Quilting in America survey found that there are 16 million active quilters in the country "meaning one out of every 20 Americans". Their buying power each year is \$3.76 billion "with dedicated quilters" spending over \$3,200. Dedicated quilters typically own \$13,000 in tools and supplies, and their fabric stash is worth close to \$6,000.
