Deb Werner read the minutes of the club's May 2022 meeting. Wayne Orrison moved to approve, seconded by Craig Sheridan; motion approved.

Duane Bunton read the treasurer's report. Dean Wanfalt moved to approve, seconded by Craig Sheridan; approved.

Total income was \$5,002, \$2,673 in expenses, income: approx. \$2,300.Dave said he feels the club needs to do some things differently for the 2023 Little Hershey event: promote our car show event, offer the same cost to inside and outside vendors, the food trucks need to be closer proximity to attendees traffic, the DJ needs to make more announcements throughout the event. Dave also said Urban Farm Girl will continue paying our fairgrounds rental cost for next year's event.

Ford Tri-Motor at Rockford Airport, June 9, 2022



The Rockford Model A and Model T clubs had a unique opportunity to be part of the Ford Tri-Motor aircraft exhibition when it visited the Rockford airport. One of less than 200 built, this 1928 Ford aircraft was part of the Transcontinental Air Transport (TAT) fleet which later became part of Trans World Airlines (TWA) which was owned by Howard Hughes. The plane is powered by a trio of Pratt & Whitney 9-cylinder

radial engines. That's 27 spark plugs to change! After the publicity photos, folks had a chance to check out the inside of the plane and even go for a ride. Aaron Crandall, Dave and Deena Lantz, and Kurt Duesterhoeft brought their T's to the event while the Model A club had ten cars on display.

There was some great camaraderie between the two clubs and several members of the Model A club commented how much they enjoy the pace of the Model T tours when they've accompanied us.
