## **Epiphany**

The season of Epiphany marks our path in the church year, and we look ahead to the preparation for the season of Lent.

We may ask, "What is Lent?"

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on personal relationships with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and to give of ourselves for others.

As we enter into Lent, I encourage us to enter into a time of deeper reflection. Yes, it is good to give up something like chocolate, French fries or Facebook. However, I encourage us to go deeper, reflecting on how this time of repentance will allow us to imitate Jesus.

Repentance is about transformation. In spring, the earth transforms from being dormant to coming to life as buds form and then flower, shoot, or leaf. During Lent, prayer and reflection move us to a our own transformation centered on living out the hopes and dreams of God on earth as it is in heaven.

Lent and Easter are early this year; therefore, the weather will keep us inside facilitating time to slow down and enter into deep reflection about how God is calling us to be the hands and feet of Jesus. I extend an invitation to join me on this pathway and carve out time each day to grow closer to the divine presence within and among us. May this sacred time take us deeper into reflection and transformation.

The forty days of Lent are a time of longing for justice and peace to a broken world, and at the same time, a season of making ourselves ready for God's masterpiece of resurrection, amazement, and joy!

# **CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS**

January 8, 2024

- Rob Rettig attended as a guest to do the annual farm report. 2023, was a good year. He asked if he could tweak the rent payments. New Vision Farms is proposing using a 5 year average for the payment basis. By doing this, the first payment will be about 90% of the projected income rather than the current 80%. This will also help New Vision Farms simplify their calculations. The net total will remain the same. Consistory agreed to the change.
- Jared led devotions and opening prayer. Adam has devotions in February -Mike in March - Eric in April.
- Minutes of the December 11, 2023, Consistory Meeting were approved as distributed.
- Carl Dettmer was offered and has accepted the job as Financial Administrator, effective January 1, 2024.
- Adam Stevenson has agreed to be on the personnel team along with Chris Coppes, VP Consistory and Congregational members Terry (Linda) Rettig and Betty (Bob) Rettig.

Consistory approved the leadership roster with several changes to phone numbers and/or email addresses.

- The Building Rental form was modified. The base fee will be \$25 for members of the church. An additional "Maintenance Fee" was added at \$100 if the janitor is to set up tear down and clean up. There will be a \$50 maintenance fee if the member does his own setup tear down and clean up. For non members, the fee is \$100 for the use of fellowship hall. There is an additional \$100 maintenance fee for set up tear down and clean up. If the renter needs a media tech, there's also a \$50 fee for use of the sound system or media. Consistory approved the changes.
- The draft of the Spiritual Council and Consistory Annual Reports was approved as distributed. The Annual Report of the Deacons will be distributed for approval when it is received.
- Consistory agreed to commit to working the gates at the Henry County fair in 2024.
- Consistory voted to Host Siberian Solstice in December 2024.

Jeri and Ron Hoellrich and several volunteers have been intermittently providing hot meals to the families that come seeking help. We have given them food from our supplies to help support this second arm of Shalom.

As you will notice in the Shalom Financial Report, our reserves have steadily been decreasing. Just like everyone else has experienced, our cost of food has risen dramatically! The Foodbank supply has steadily decreased, which has forced us to buy more food at retail prices.

We have been thankful for our St. John's Faith Family as well as many other area churches who have given freely to our mission! On the first Tuesday in February we are completing our 20th season of helping families. We hope to continue being a vital link to those that need assistance!

We also thank Larry Hockman for his many years of service to the pantry! Larry has been the person who always made sure we had plenty of volunteers to man the pantry nights. John Hahn will be taking Larry's place, his phone number is in the church's phone directory.
