In Praise of Presbyters

*“Do not let loyalty and faithfulness forsake you.
Bind them around your neck,
and write them on the tablet of your heart.”
Proverbs 3:3*

- Personnel announced a new nursery caregiver and the ongoing search for an accompanist.

In Proverbs 3:3, we’re told to engrave faithfulness on our hearts. In the next verse it says, “So you will find favor and good repute in the sight of God and of people.” Our elders model this. They serve faithfully, and they do have our favor and respect.

Session Highlights



The Session met on Monday, August 13, 2018 at 7PM in the Conference Room. (A complete copy of the Session minutes can be found on the Session bulletin board in the Office Wing.) Below are a few highlights from the meeting.

At the beginning of each Session meeting, the Session spends some time discussing missional issues or other concerns that are in the forefront of the life of the church. In light of our upcoming work with PneuMatrix, Dr. Lund previewed some of the ideas our PneuMatrix Leadership Team will encounter during this process. Some of their work will center around Adaptive Change Theory and practice. In the book the team will study, change is categorized in two ways: technical change - such as deciding on a new hymnal or proposing new Sunday School curriculum - and adaptive change. It is adaptive because we do not know what it looks like, radical new ways of using our DNA to let go of the tried and true that have gotten us to this point. Adaptive change is far scarier than technical change, but with the work of the Holy Spirit we can be guided to make the changes God has planned for Westminster.

Budget and Stewardship – The Budget and Stewardship committee moved to accept the "Legacy Plan" which will allow us to create a planned giving program. This is just the first step of a long process, so look for more information in the coming months. October 28th is the date for our Celebration Sunday, our pledge cards will be received on this day.

Christian Education – A new policy was brought forward from the committee as it relates to supervision and child safety. The policy states: *children 4 and under must be accompanied by a parent for all meals. The parent must be participating in church activities if the child is to remain in the nursery for childcare apart from the meal time. Children 5 years to 5th grade may stay in the nursery only when child care is available and when the family caregiver is involved with church activities.* This new policy goes into effect immediately. The committee is partnering with Presbyterian Women and the Fellowship Committee to offer a special Trick or Treat event for children on Wednesday, October 31st.

Fellowship – Adrienne Askew reported that on September 13th, Salt and Pepper will host Steve Barfield, former bodyguard for Don Knotts. The next blood drive will take place October 3rd.

Membership – Joni Nelson is in the process of ordering cups and pens for our visitors at the Welcome Table in the Narthex. The committee is also seeking volunteers to greet visitors in the Narthex.



Youth News

Our lake trip to Red Top Marina in July was refreshing. An armada of kayaks followed by a pontoon boat headed to a nearby sandy beach where we swam for nearly four hours before returning. Even Richard Merritt joined us in the water for a lot of laughs and fun. Later, we discussed our plans for the year and have come up with a new format for our youth.

There will be four lesson groups. Alpha will be for all new members to learn what the others already learned last year and to understand the dynamics of the group. Beta will be for our younger boys and Gamma will be for our younger girls. Omega will be for the older group and will be mixed. We already started and will be teaching a main part of the Bible focusing on the Pentateuch, history, prophets, and the gospel, while also allowing relevant questions and discussions. Property Committee

The Floyd County Sherriff's Office came to WPC in March to talk about church safety and preparedness, and in turn a task force researched and wrote a WPC Security and Emergency Plan that was approved by Session in August. This Plan strives to create an environment where we are able gather to worship in a safe place while being more aware of our surroundings to prevent possible threats.

Our plan is threefold:

1. **Be aware and informed** of our surroundings and fellow worshippers before a medical or safety emergency occurs so basic emergency procedures can be implemented easily. Be sure to read the plan!
2. **Plan ahead** to identify potential issues, educate the team, communicate and review basic procedures with the congregation (occasionally conduct drills), and provide ongoing training (First Aid, CPR, AED, NOMI, etc.) for volunteers.
3. **Take action** in the event of a need with procedures and volunteers in place for appropriate follow through

In an effort to be best prepared in the case of an emergency at Westminster, awareness and safety information will be shared with the congregation during the month of September. We will also ask for volunteers to be a part of a Security Team and a Medical Team. Training will be available to interested members in the future. We will send the Security and Emergency Plan document via email to all members and there will be a few copies in the Narthex for interested readers. The plan will also be placed in several locations along with new first aid kits.

Our prayer is that we never need this Security and Emergency Plan. However, in the event that we do, we want to have the confidence that we are prepared to react appropriately. If you have questions, please ask the Property Committee and we'll get you an answer!


