1. Kelly Sickafoose welcomed everyone to the meeting.

3. Financial Reports

• Local Drug Free Communities Fund

- 2019 collections: September: \$1,060.98; YTD: \$35,363.75
- 2019 expenditures: See Treasurer's Report

4. News Around the State and Nation

- October is "Talk about your medicines" month. This year's focus is preventing opioid abuse across all ages.
- The Center for Disease Control and Prevention says the number of vaping-related injuries continues to increase and has surpassed the previously reported estimate of 530.
- Walmart has announced it will no longer sell e-cigarettes at its stores in the United States.
- Opioid-related deaths decreased 5% while fentanyl deaths rose 11% from the second half of 2017 to the first half of 2018.

5. DFAC Business/Discussions

• 2020 DFAC Grants

- Grants are due today, October 23 at noon.
- Grants will be reviewed and submitted to the coalition for approval at the next meeting.
- Kelly will attend the County Council and Commissioners meetings in December for their approval, then they will proceed to the State for approval.

• Student Role Models

- Kelly Sickafoose reported that not all local high schools have not been conducting drug-free youth meetings.
- Discussion followed regarding the nomination process. It was suggested that the application process be open to all qualified applicants. The individual high schools could then help narrow down the applicants.
- Discussion also addressed whether questions should be supplied in advance of the applicant interviews. No decision was made.

- **Regional Nominations: Individual and Program**
 - Nominations are due 12/15/19.
 - Nominees must be a volunteer. Nominees are not required to be a coalition member or associated with a DFAC grantee.
 - Suggestions should be sent to Kelly Sickafoose.
- **Election of Officers**
 - Kelly reported that election of officers will be conducted in November. The officers meet quarterly.
- **State Drug Free Communities Pilot Projects**
 - Coalition members discussed potential programming for this funding opportunity.
 - Kelly will distribute the RFP to the treatment providers via email.
- **Recovery House**
 - No communications have been received from Oxford House.
- **Communities Talk: Town Hall Meetings to Prevent Underage Drinking Initiative**
 - Kelly reported that the area high schools are interested in a December presentation.
 - Dawn Findbloom was suggested as a potential speaker.
 - Tim Hirschy suggested incorporating stories of youth recovery.
 - Kelly added that funding is available for a poster campaign contest.
- **What drug/alcohol issues are you seeing?**
 - Meth from Ohio has been identified in Adams County.

6. For the Good of the Order/Member Sharing

- Patrick Miller recognized Kelly Sickafoose as recipient of McMillen Health's Vitality Award in the prevention category.
- Barb McKee shared that the Positive Resource Connection provides HIV and Hepatitis C tests at the Adams County DOH on a regular basis. Their next visit is scheduled for November 29, 11:00 – 1:30, but that may change due to the holiday.
- The Adams Wells Crisis Center is hosting an open house on 10/30/19. The Center is scheduled to re-open in January 2020.
- Unwanted medication can be dropped off on Saturday, October 26, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Last year, over 800 pounds of medications were collected.
