The Blessed Trinity is the core doctrine of Catholic faith; it is one of the most important teachings of the Church. It is all about God: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. The teaching tells us that there is only One God, yet in three Persons. The term Trinity can be simply understood as although there are Three Persons, there is only One God. The oneness in the Trinity is in the term itself: Tri - Three and Unity - One. The Church teaches us that it is a mystery. A mystery in the Catholic tradition does not mean there is something bizarre or incomprehensible, but that it is supremely comprehensible and beyond our limited intellects.

The Church teaches us that we are God's children and that God invites us into the very heart of His divine life. This is a supernatural life of grace, love, and unity. We manifest this truth when we grow in love and foster unity within our families, in community and within our personal lives. To grow in unity in our personal life means to harmonize God's will in our thoughts, actions and words. Celebrating the Blessed Trinity also reminds us that the Trinity is very close to us: God the Father created us, God the Son, Jesus, died to save us, and God the Holy Spirit helps us to be holy.

LIVING THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

THEY DEVOTED THEMSELVES TO THE TEACHINGS OF THE APOSTLES, THE COMMUNAL LIFE, THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD AND PRAYER. - ACTS 2:42

And they devoted themselves to: the communal life

The communal life (the Greek word is the well-known *koinonia*) and the breaking of the bread, are activities that are essential acts of Christian life. The community is reoriented toward divine love through the resurrected life of Jesus. It is God who saves and expands the community, but not without our cooperation. God worked in and through people willing to teach and be taught, to believe in, perform and receive signs and wonders, and to create mutual *koinonia*.

This verse from Acts highlights the way we should live as a Eucharistic people. During the National Eucharistic Revival our parish will be hosting Acts 2:42 Groups. These small groups will meet once a month from fall to spring. These small faith-sharing groups will share a time of prayer and fellowship as they learn and reflect on a message from Bishop Medley. 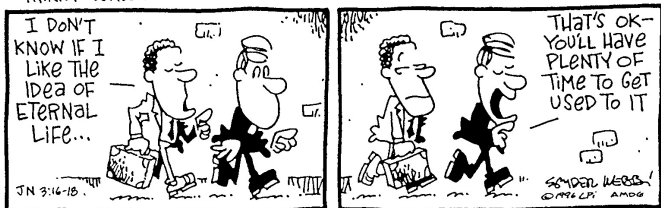

SPIRITUAL LIFE COMMITTEE

Saint Norbert

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.
