

#### God's Power is at its best in our Weakness

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest and first of the four canonical Gospels and contains some of the earliest memories of Jesus with a guide to discipleship to an early Christian community as followers of a crucified Saviour. It is believed that Mark was writing for Christians at time when they were being persecuted and was calling them to remain true disciples of the crucified Christ. The threats they were facing were connected to the life and way of Jesus. The Gospel today locates Jesus teaching in the synagogue of his own home town but his authority is rejected by His own people.

In this Jesus experienced the fate of many Hebrew prophets.

Jesus returned as a proclaimer of God's kingdom present amongst us. The neighbours were impressed by the way He spoke and by what He had done but most could not break through their preconceived notions of Religious Authority and Observations to recognise the gift of God being offered to each of them through this humble but gifted person in their midst. Jesus was disempowered by their lack of faith to be able to see their world differently- to look beyond appearances and to make any difference in the lives of those around them.

As His own family and neighbours who believed they knew Jesus too well, the same can apply to those brought up as Christians such that we can fail to address the challenge of faith before us. We can domesticate Jesus, remake Him in a set comfortable devotional image to turn to in our weakness, and be so familiar with His words that they lose their cutting edge. We can miss the challenges they place before us living as "Church" – not as an institution – but as the people of a loving, giving and all-inclusive God. Then again awareness of our human weakness can help us to empathise with others - to be compassionate and courageous towards them as God is towards each of us.

This, after all, is the Jesus way of mission. And His mission is ours –however weak we may feel.

Mark 6:1-6

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house': and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laving his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

THE NICENE CREED.
