The Word of God Alive: Discussing the Readings with your children

Can you think of a time when you felt left out or rejected?

Can you think of a time

when you might have made someone else feel left out or rejected?

In today's Gospel, John tells Jesus he and the disciples had seen a man performing miracles in Jesus' name and they tried to stop him. The disciples thought they were special, set apart, and only they could act in the name of Jesus. Jesus corrects John and the other disciples. He explains that if someone is performing miracles in Jesus' name, he must also be a follower of Jesus, even though he is not one of the Twelve. Jesus explains that the man's actions show that he belongs to Jesus.

Who does Jesus choose to live as his followers?

Has Jesus chosen you to live as his follower?

When we were baptized, our parents promised that they would help us grow up to love and be followers of Jesus. In fact, God created each one of us with special gifts that help us to live as followers of Jesus. We can look at some of the disciples as examples. Peter was confident, courageous and driven. Andrew, Peter's brother, kept a low profile. Thomas was a skeptic, but he grew to trust that Jesus would take care of everything. Each of the disciples had unique gifts that helped them not only live as followers of Jesus, but also lead others to believe in Jesus.




What gifts has God given you that help you live as a follower of Jesus?

I will be away this next week, Monday through Friday (Sept. 30th - Oct. 4th in the morning) because all of our regular diocesan priests will be at our annual priest workshops down in Maryland. Therefore, we do not have daily masses this week at the parish, however, we will still have adoration Wednesday evening (5:30 - 6:30 pm) and Friday throughout the day (9:00 am - 7:00 pm); praying a holy hour or just any amount of time for an increase in vocations is very powerful. 

Book of the Month September and October 2024



The Book of the Month for both September and October of 2024 will be An Introduction to Prayer written by Bishop Robert Barron and published by Word on Fire. I personally love talking to people about prayer. For example, engaging some very important questions such as: How much should I pray every day? When I try to pray, what kind of things do I try to say to God? How do I hear God's voice? Are there different types of prayer, and if so, why does that matter for my life?

The problem is that I only have so many hours in

each day to talk to people one on one about prayer. One really helpful solution to this problem is to read a solid Catholic book on the topic, and Bishop Barron just came out with this gem at the perfect time! He does a wonderful job of hitting on so many of the essential topics when it comes to prayer like - how to deal with distractions or different approaches and mindsets to take when you try to pray. Prayer can seem intimidating, but I promise you that if you continue trying your best to pray and learn about prayer (for example, by reading this book or just coming to the discussion of it!), you will grow in your ability to encounter Christ in your heart and soul when you are praying.

We will get together to discuss this book on Wednesday, November 6th from 7:30 – 8:30 pm, and this book is only about 125 pages long, so it is very readable even if it takes you some time to snag a copy! Even if you don't have time to read this book, please consider coming to meeting in the social hall on Nov. 6th, and I will do my best to summarize my favorite parts and bring some good discussion into the room as well.
