Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

29th Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 22:34-40

Death and Taxes! In November 1789, Benjamin Franklin wrote a letter to a French scientist friend named Jean-Baptiste Le Roy, wherein Franklin says, "Our new Constitution is now established, everything seems to promise it will be durable; but, in this world, **nothing is certain except death and taxes."** (Franklin will pass away the next April, 1790). Jesus definitively solved the 'death problem' by His resurrection from the dead! And our gospel reading provides Jesus' resolution to the 'tax' problem, too.

Of course, Jesus is not simply dealing with the question of good citizenship. He teaches that somebody has to pay for the upkeep of the roads and for basic community services like common defense and protective patrols. Every citizen has the responsibility to provide for the common good by chipping in some contribution to the maintenance of society. Our Catholic Catechism teaches the same principle: CCC Article # 2240 says that, "Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country, as St Paul reminds us: "Pay to all of them their dues, taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due" (Romans 13:7)" To Jesus, taxation is simple enough: "every laborer deserves his payment' (Luke 10:7). For someone to guard the community, maintain our public areas and keep civic order requires that each citizen offers a contributory share as a common duty. But in today's reading, Jesus is being presented with a 'thornier' problem. It is not just about tax. The Pharisees (teamed up with the Herodians) are out to discredit Jesus in the eyes of the 'people' (because who likes taxes?) or worse yet, to frame Jesus against the Roman Emperor (tempting Him to make 'anti-tax' statements). Notice the 'set-up' language Matthew details. "The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech" (Matthew 15:21) It is a 'plotted trap'! However, Jesus, senses their sinister designs, and responds with such revelatory wisdom that everyone is amazed at His 'turning of the tables' (which literally happens when Jesus converts the famous tax collector Matthew leading him to step away from his 'tax table post' in Matt 9:9). Jesus first asks to see such a coin that would be required to make a payment to Caesar (for a devout Jew, the coin has blasphemous words on it declaring Caesar to be GOD)/ Interestingly, Jesus does not possess such an 'anti-Christian' coin. BUT, the Pharisees must have a pocketful of them! They 'hand' one to Him, and He asks 'Whose inscription and image is on it'? (Matt 22:20). This would evoke all kind of problems for devout Jews who 'forbid' the creation and publication of graven images (Exodus 20:4-5). When the Pharisees respond that it is 'Caesar', then Jesus basically responds, 'Caesar must have lost It, so give it back to him." The 'empire' coin in the pockets of the Pharisees, and its frequent use by them was a 'loyalty token' affiliating the Pharisees with Caesar, and the 'Herodians' brand is obvious as their very group name exposes them to be 'minions' of King Herod! At this point in the confrontation, Jesus really gets crafty by invoking whose 'image and likeness' is out there circulating! He is calling our attention to a first principle of theology: Creation. Who made all of this? Most importantly, Who made us? Caesar makes good coins, but God makes good people! A coin may bear Caesar's image, but our souls bear the image of our maker, God. As Genesis tells us, "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." Considering this background, we see that when Jesus says, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and give to God what belongs to God" Jesus is telling us that Caesar may want our money, but God wants our desires our hearts. We may or may not have a coin in our pocket with Caesar's image on it, but we do have a priceless soul in our body with God's imprint on it! I need to recognize and claim that above all else. And not just me, but everyone has that stamp of God upon his/her soul, and I need to recognize that too. God's image in each fellow human being. We all share that common bond, which affiliates us with each other. Belonging to Caesar's kingdom, means holding his coins to pay him. But I belong to God's Kingdom just by simply treasuring His seal upon my neighbor's soul, and paying respect to His dignity in everyone else's soul! Peace, Fr Brian
