Well, it happened. It seems just like yesterday that it was January 2022. How time flies. Research shows that 22% of the US population attends church regularly; 27% identify as agnostic, atheist, or have no interest in church; and 6% associate with a religion other than Christianity. That leaves 45% of the population that identifies as Christians but has no church. I believe many of us recognize that we live in a post-Christian culture. Most people in America do not have a church even though most would consider themselves to be Christian. Many do not think going to church is important and some would even go as far as to say that going to church is not required to be a Christian. I know that those two comments are not the only reasons many of the 45% do not attend church. I hear quite often from visitors that the first impression of First Christian Church is that we're warm and welcoming. So why are they not returning? How can we make that change for that 45%? Well, I believe we have to take the next step, to be willing, as disciples, to establish relationships. Maybe we think we don't need another friend, but maybe we would find the best friend ever. The next person you meet could change your life, or you might help change theirs. We can all begin to prepare for the future today. We have a great harvest that is building up around Weston. More and more new housing developments are going up which allows for more opportunities to touch people's lives and be that church they are seeking. When members of the community walk into our building, they need to know that they are welcome — that everyone is welcome. It might be your first thought to connect with your friends at church (and expect them to connect with you). Instead, we need to begin seeking out the person we don't or barely know. I read a quote from Sam Walton, the founder of Walmart, once said. "I want the community to know we are a one-stop-shop. Whatever they need, they need to know they can come here." What if First Christian Church is the one-stop-shop for people in our community who want a better life, focused on a strong and growing Christian faith? I think everyone wants a better life. Let's be the place that helps people be better, and feel loved, and accepted. We have an exciting future before us as a church. Let's see where God takes us, and where he wants us to go... let us be ready and let us be that one-stop-shop church. Let us focus on reaching out to the new communities that are being developed around us and those individuals around us that we need to get to know. Are you ready? The vision, the over-arching goal - "Christ for a Better Life"!

If Not Me, Who

"For even if I boast somewhat freely about the authority the Lord gave us for building you up rather than pulling you down, I will not be ashamed of it." 2 Corinthians 10:8

The Holy Spirit gives believers the exclusive authority to encourage other

believers. No one else can provide this service to your brothers and sisters in Christ. In other words, a Christian is the Holy Spirit's only officially endorsed and sanctioned ambassador of encouragement to God's sons and daughters. He is looking for us to shoulder this responsibility personally, proudly, and powerfully to defeat discouragement and unfaithfulness in our spiritual family. By definition, unwholesome exchanges between believers involve tearing down versus building up. The Holy Spirit inside a believer helps to deliver targeted and helpful words that impact the heart of other believers to fit their situation. Spirit-filled encouragement says no to unhelpful or self-serving comments in order to say yes to directed support. This means listening well so we can encourage well. This means being okay with another believer's success and blessings in the midst of our own failures or tough times, knowing that God is working all things toward His purpose, good and bad. It means overcoming jealousy, envy, conflicts, and personality differences through the healing work and security the Holy Spirit provides.
