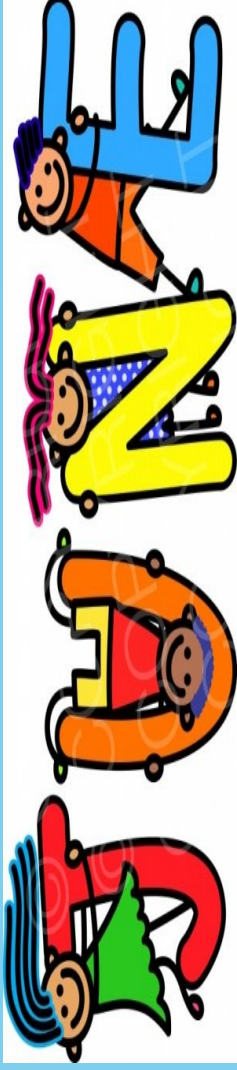

## *The Reverend's Ruminations*

Whew, believe it or not we're all clear! Clear of what, you might wonder? Well, I'm sure some of you probably thought we would still have a few snow piles around in June!?! Spring may not feel like a very long season in southern Minnesota this year—as the high school athletes can attest—but we're all glad it finally took hold. Not the least of these are our farmers, and I pray that their planting season has gone smoothly and safely as God prepares to send moisture and warm sunshine in accordance with creation's plan.

Sunday School has wrapped up a fun-filled transition year, and our Christian Education Board is already making plans for next fall's kick-off. In the meantime, as was recently highlighted during worship announcements, there are great summer camp opportunities available at Pilgrim Point, Lakeshore Center at Okoboji, and other locations. If your child or grandchild has never been to church camp, I hope you'll encourage them to attend; they are a great environment of Christian learning and growth for kids of all ages. As I look at our family calendar for the summer months, it seems like activities are already beginning to fill it, and I'm sure that yours is much the same. So many things to do and people to see, so many "summer-only" places to visit. Where have those seemingly endless lazy summer days of my youth gone?

As you line up your family's getaways for the summer, please include First Congregational United Church of Christ in your plans. We switch to our 9:30am summer schedule starting Memorial Day weekend specifically so that you can worship God and still have most of Sunday available for additional summer activities. Even if you are out of town, I'd like to ask that you remember our congregation with your regular financial gifts. All too often churches find that tithe and offering numbers suffer alongside attendance during the summer months, which can make it hard to keep up with even regular operating expenses.

Some months ago, I heard a comment on a radio program that struck me as a profound truth. The quote, I later found, is credited to a man named Gordon Dahl: "Most middle-class Americans tend to worship their work, to work at their play, and to play at their worship." I don't have to ask whether you can see yourself or someone you know in that description—I know that most of us can identify with his statement.

We are bombarded every day with duties, responsibilities, phone calls, emails, emergency situations, and requests for help (or just a plain visit or meal) from family, friends, neighbors, organizations, co-workers, and sometimes complete strangers! And if we can pull ourselves away from all that work for awhile, then there are always our hobbies. Many of these are worthwhile pursuits in their own right—whether they keep us entertained, happy, healthy, or just plain sane—but they also usually demand time, money, and no small amount of work to be done well.

And where does that leave your worship and spiritual life? Low on the priority list? Something you know you should be doing more regularly, but just can't get to by the time you schedule everything else? And what about when you do get to the worship service? Are you tuned in to the Scripture readings, the prayers, and the sermon, or are you already planning the next part of your day or week in your head? Are you just playing at your worship?

In his Letter to the Romans, the Apostle Paul writes, "*I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.*" (Romans 12:1-2, NRSV)

Now, Paul isn't telling us to give up our jobs, our extra activities, or even our hobbies specifically. In fact, elsewhere in the same letter he even speaks about the civil responsibility of being subject to governing authorities. Paul is not oblivious to the fact that we live in the world and must work to provide for the well being of ourselves and our families. But what he is concerned with is that we are devoting too much of our time and effort to things that have little heavenly consequence. Paul challenges us toward an honest assessment of our priorities and an openness to the discernment of God's will for our lives. Listen closely and honestly, and perhaps you'll find that you've been setting the priorities in your life instead of God. Isn't it time that changed?

# ANNOUNCING..

## On Line Access to Church Directory and Your Giving History

Last fall the church council voted to update our membership software, which had never really been fully utilized. Our secretaries were having to keep multiple lists with people's names, addresses, phone numbers, etc. Sometimes they were having to update things in 6-8 different places! This software is also used to track pledges and giving, and that function was no longer going to be supported by the company.

The new software we chose is called ChurchTrac. It has allowed us to have everything we need in one place, without keeping multiple lists. It also has a Congregational Access feature. This will enable those who have e-mail addresses entered into the software to see their own information on line. This includes your name and address, an on-line version of the church directory, and your giving history. ONLY YOU will be able to see your giving history.

If you have an e-mail address on file with the church you should have gotten an e-mail about this. If you did not get an e-mail but you would like access, please give the e-mail address you would like to use to Ann. Once she has entered it into the software you will be able to log in. 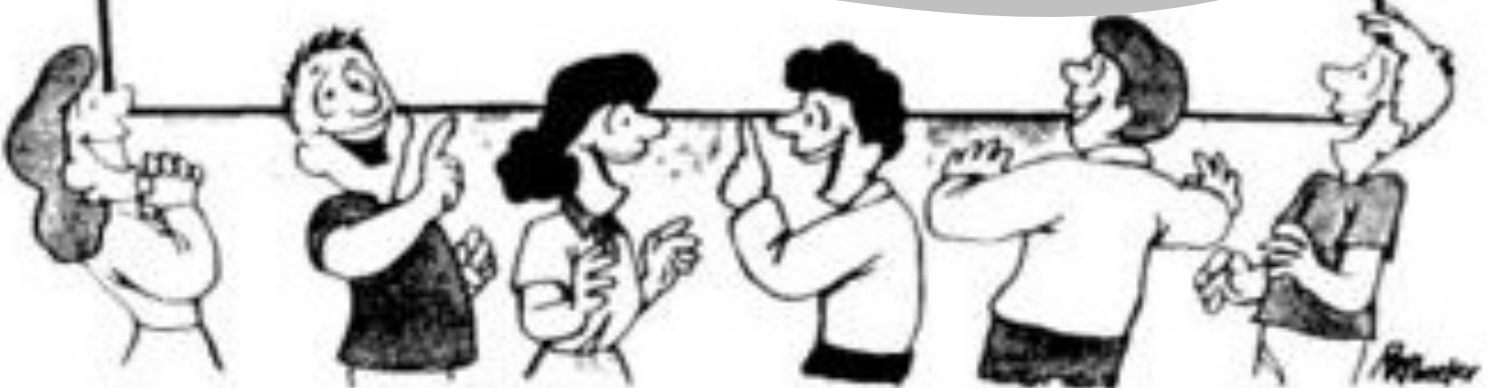

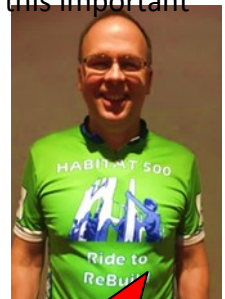


**July 15-21, 2018 500 miles. 7 days. 135 participants.**

#### DEAN GROTTÉ INTERVIEW

"Did you know this building is wood frame with concrete and brick fascia?" The 1927 structure is part of the third generation heritage Dean Grotte can share. His paternal grandfather, Andrew Grotte, helped lay all the concrete floors in the church. His maternal grandparents, Clarence and Margaret Pannkuk, were long time members of First Congregational Church. Parents Stanley and Kathryn Grotte had four children: Robert, Gary (deceased as a child), Dean, James and Laura all of whom were confirmed in the church.

Dean remembers confirmation classes with the Reverend Richard Engstrom, and that he and some of his fellow confirmands "might have" done some pranks. He was confirmed, however, and has remained an active member bringing his wife, Donna, and their two sons Greg and Mark into the fold. He appears to know every nook and cranny in this building, and is the "go to guy" when something needs repair or replacement. He has served over 35 years on the Facilities Board, and presently is the Liaison to the Church Council. One might say he is the unofficial caretaker of the building, spending hours each week making sure all is well with the building.

Asked what has kept him active, Dean replied that "People care in this church". He went on to say that at times of difficulty, including the death of his parents and the loss of Kevin (a nephew whom they helped raise) in an accident, their family has

been surrounded by love and support. He remembers with fondness the mentoring by Art and Bernice Dvorak, and the fun he had with Delores Thate as she made egg coffee for all the funerals. Helping with the infamous Thanksgiving Dinners was a highlight, as was helping with all the famous food that is served from all the kitchens, past and present. "This church community has brought many friendships, and I love that we all care for one another and others."

Dean is particularly interested in making our building accessible and welcoming to all persons to serve more people and to make the building sustainable. He points out all the excellent changes made in recent years to make that possible. That includes new plumbing, new wiring, metal roof, and other safety measures.

"How Great Thou Art" and "The Stone Has Rolled Away" are hymns that have great meaning for Dean. Coupled with those faith expressions, it is clear that he brings great faith and an interest in sharing that with others, as well as showing God's love through ministry to others and in caring for God's House.

As we celebrate our 150 years, it seems a good idea to talk with some of our members who were raised in the church, were confirmed here, and remain active members. We are blessed to hear that history, and to celebrate the heritage of three and four generations of devoted members.

Grotte and Grill seem to go together. Donna shared their family recipe for a favorite burger.

### **Grotte's Barbecued Burgers**

1½ lbs. ground beef  
1 beaten egg  
1/3 c. quick cooking oats  
¼ t. onion salt  
¼ t. garlic salt  
¼ t. pepper  
1/8 t. salt

Mix together and shape into patties.

Sauce:

1 c. ketchup  
½ c. packed brown sugar  
1/3 c. sugar  
1/4 c. honey  
1 t. prepared mustard  
1/4 c. molasses  
1 ½ t. worcestershire sauce  
¼ t. salt  
¼ t. liquid smoke  
½ t. pepper

Mix together and put on burgers before grilling. Can also add more sauce on burgers after they are grilled.



Dean Grotte's mom, Margaret, was a great baker and cook. Dean became the original "cookie monster" and still loves chocolate chip cookies. This is Margaret's recipe:

### **Pannkuk/Grotte Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Cookies**

1 c. shortening  
¾ c. brown sugar  
¾ c. white sugar  
2 beaten eggs  
1 t. vanilla  
1 t. soda dissolved in 1 t. water  
1 t. salt  
1 ½ c. flour  
2 c. oatmeal  
12 oz. chocolate chips

Cream shortening, add sugar, beaten eggs and vanilla. Add flour, soda, salt oatmeal and chips. Bake at 375 degrees for 8-10 minutes.



# PLEASE NOTE



Another four weeks have passed since the last report. The following is a summary of what was received during those weeks and where we are as of the 13th of May 2018.

\$4,306 worth of Fareway slips were received or 2.29% of the total needed. Fareway is now at 87.72% of the goal, or \$131,580 of the \$150,000 goal.

\$12,593 worth of Hy-Vee slips were received or 8.40% of the total needed. Hy-Vee is now at 80.30% of the goal, or \$120,448 of the \$150,000 goal.

Keep those slips coming. Even older slips can still be used. The first three weeks of this period were very good, but for the week ending the 13th of May, less than a total of \$750 worth were turned in. Keep them coming.
