Ninety-nine percent of our students who demonstrate need receive some form of tuition assistance through academic, out-of-state or merit-based scholarships, or federal aid.

## **FEDERAL AID**

Completing a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) early will ensure you receive all the financial aid to which you're entitled. You can complete the FAFSA as early as *OCT. 1*. The priority consideration deadline for FAFSA is *APRIL 1*. Georgia State's FAFSA code is *OO1574*. Visit *sfs.gsu.edu* and *fafsa.gov* to explore your options.

### **VISIT CAMPUS**

### **APPLY**

First-year students apply through the Common Application. Submit your application, \$60 application fee and an optional letter of recommendation.

Georgia State is *test-optional* through Summer 2025 for students whose high school GPA is 3.4 or higher.\* If your high school GPA is below 3.4, submit your SAT scores through *collegeboard.org* using Georgia State's code, *5251*, and/or ACT scores through *act.org* using the code *0826*.\*\* Get all the details for submitting materials and applying by scanning the QR Code.
